Rotary's early emblem was a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust). It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who was an engraver. He designed the emblem to represent both civilization and movement. Most of the early Rotary clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another.

The present emblem, 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted in 1924. A keyway was added to signify usefulness. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 International Convention.

Dear Mr Flemming,

I am writing to in relation to problem gambling in our community and seek your input for suggestions to address it.

As you might be aware, I have been an advocate for stronger laws governing online gambling. In particular, I have called for a prohibition on gambling companies being able to offer credit to their customers. My interest in this came about from a local Wantirna resident who was given \$80,000 in credit from Sportsbet despite him being unemployed! I would also like to see greater restrictions on the ubiquitous advertising of online gambling.

Last week, the Coalition released a Discussion Paper on Gambling reform (Attached). It outlines the Coalition's priorities, and seeks feedback. The Paper includes the issues that I have raised and also includes suggestions in relation to pokies and online gaming (ie online casinos).

I would welcome your feedback on the issues outlined in the Paper or any other suggestions that you or your community might have to address problem gambling. The suggestions will be considered by the Coalition's Gambling Task Force, of which I am a member.

Gambling is a form of recreation for thousands of people. But it can also destroy peoples' lives. We need to strike the right balance to protect vulnerable people while minimising the impact on people who enjoy gambling responsibly. I hope you can assist as we grapple with these issues.
