Rotary's early emblem was a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust). It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who was an engraver. He designed the emblem to represent both civilization and movement. Most of the early Rotary clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another.

The present emblem, 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted in 1924. A keyway was added to signify usefulness. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 International Convention.

Peter showed a Powerpoint presentation and spoke about recognising stroke symptoms. He explained that stroke is caused by the interruption of blood supply to the brain it can be a clot or a bleed.

Fast - Face—has it dropped on one side (eye and/or mouth)

Arms - Can the person life both above their head?

Speech - Is it slurred. Does the person understand what you are saying?

Time - Time is critical.

Literature was distributed

Stroke impacts more than just the victim

Stroke is not confined to older people

Prevention: (Reduce the risk) - Know your personal risk factors; Be physically active and exercise regularly; Avoid obesity by keeping to a healthy diet; Limit alcohol consumption; Avoid cigarette smoke; Learn to recognise the warning signs. These also apply to diabetes and cardiac.
