Rotary's early emblem was a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust). It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who was an engraver. He designed the emblem to represent both civilization and movement. Most of the early Rotary clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another.

The present emblem, 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted in 1924. A keyway was added to signify usefulness. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 International Convention.



PROGRAM: Knox Infolink - Zillah McLaren

Been going since 1993. Initially community info then everyway relief. Funded by Knox Council but it's own organization. 48 volunteers on a weekly basis. Directing people to support is a major function. Called twice a week from a local supermarket and given fresh produce to hand out to people; also called from Dandenong food bowl and spend \$1,000—\$1,600 per month on food.

Have a budget assist program to help in a long term education way. Have a “no interest” loan scheme to purchase household equipment. It provides opportunities to people—they pay back fortnightly. If they do pay back and can save \$500 in addition, they can open an NAB account and get a \$500 gift.

Knox Sharing Joy Appeal is a Christmas gift/parcel project. (Toys/hampers). 8th September, 2012 they are having a trivia night to aid Christmas appeal.

The type of people that present -

- People not best intentions (sell their vouchers etc)
- People who simply can't make ends meet. Some are paying over 50% of their income in rent.
- People who have never previously had to get this type of help. This is increasing.

Infolink can only provide \$20 vouchers for a single or \$50 for a family. Many experience social isolation.

Knox has a high incidence of domestic violence.

Could not operate without volunteers.

Zillah told of a client who had been assisted by the Budget Assist Program—a woman (3 children), could not work, budget developed for her and application for utility relief assistance lodged. The help made a long term difference. Over 1,000 assisted in this way over the past 12 months. With emergency relief—over 5,700.

Questions were asked re increasing numbers, direction of help requests by council, donations and solutions for the future.

Located at 136 Boronia Road. Donations can be made on line.

President passed on Merv Lincoln's thanks for the track pants/tops which had been donated; reminded members to let her know if they wanted to attend District Changeover; advised the Housekeeping duties for next week. Rob Parsons spoke about Wantirna's plight. Meeting Closed at 9:00 pm
