Rotary's early emblem was a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust). It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who was an engraver. He designed the emblem to represent both civilization and movement. Most of the early Rotary clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another.

The present emblem, 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted in 1924. A keyway was added to signify usefulness. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 International Convention.

For the participating 94 organisations, they have shared in the \$79,557.86 distribution. This amount is distributed on a pro rata basis to the number of tickets each organization sells.

The end result for the committee was that a surplus of the order of \$1,000 occurred. This surplus is held a part of our operating capital reserves. We have had deficit results in past years and our capital reserves act as a bulwark against a possible deficit. For the participating organizing Rotary Clubs this represents a return of \$ 74 772 to the participating 79 nt-for-profit organisations.

Thank you for participating in the raffle. Should you be working with a community based not-forprofit organisation we would welcome there involvement in the 2013 raffle. After all the raffle is intended to be a self-help vehicle for not-for-profit community organisations.

PROGRAM: The Eighth Day—Alistair Smith

Alistair, originally from Scotland, moved to Australia in the 1960's. He was a journalist and travel writer and won four national awards for his travel writing. He has just published his first novel—*The Eighth Day*.
