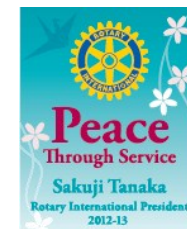

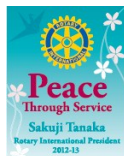

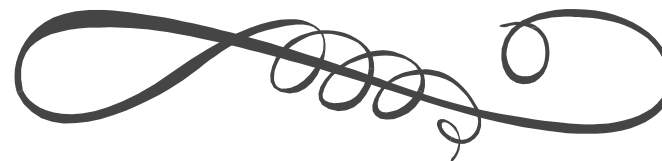

The Australian Doctors Orchestra (ADO) is a unique national membership of medical professionals who are classically trained musicians. Since its first concert in 1993, the orchestra has played a concert every year in every state and used each occasion to raise funds for charity.

This year, for the first time, they will be performing two concerts. In Melbourne for their second concert of 2012, the orchestra will play their 20th performance, where 160 medical professionals from around Australia will share two days of final rehearsals that will culminate in a performance on the Sunday afternoon.

This year's ADO Concert will perform under the baton of conductor **Warwick Stengårds**. Following a four-year engagement as Assistant Generalmusikdirektor at the Volksoper Wien and a seven year tenure as Erster Kapellmeister at the Luzerner Theater, Warwick Stengårds is now a freelance conductor based in Vienna. In Europe and Australia, Stengårds has studied with such notable conductors as Peter Eötvös, Vittorio Parisi, Ronald Zollman, Robert Rosen and Vladimir Verbitsky.

The 2012 Melbourne Concert will feature:

Brahms: *Academic Overture*

Mendelssohn: *Violin Concerto* and

Stenhammar: *Symphony No. 2*

The orchestra will feature acclaimed violinist **Natsuko Yoshimoto** performing Mendelssohn's Violin Concerto. Born in Japan, Natsuko began playing the violin at the age of three and won a full scholarship to study at the Yehudi Menuhin School in England when she was eleven. She received direct guidance and teaching under Lord Menuhin and Wen Zhou Li. In 1993, she was honoured to perform solo in the presence of the Queen and the Royal Family at Buckingham Palace. Natsuko is the Concertmaster with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra. She was the leader of the Australian String Quartet and then the Grainger Quartet until the end of 2008.

The **B. Braun Australia Group** has proudly supported the ADO since 2009. The members of the Orchestra donate their time and the proceeds of this concert will be given to Australian Rotary Health.

 - What objectives do you want to achieve?

 - What are your key messages?
 - What results do you expect?
 - How do you use marketing? - Brochures/web sites/ social media/ bulletin/telephone/email/correspondence.
 - Need to promote that Rotary has access to good speakers—we should exploit this.
- What is a marketing plan?
 - Supports the vision of the organization
 - Identifies objectives to achieve this vision.
 - Outlines actions that will fulfill the objectives

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

With a week to go Winter will be behind us; September will mark the start of Spring. As I walk each morning I have noticed the buds of a new season about to burst, giving life to new growth. It's a good feeling to enjoy a little warmth in the air.

Last week we inducted Virginia Rutledge into the Club. Once again I welcome her. Rahul will be inducted when he returns (which will be soon).

My request for members to help identify potential new members from the classification listings I distributed a couple of weeks ago is still outstanding. If we are able to "bud" a few more members we will blossom and grow new life into our Club. Please give this more thought.

Presidents and Immediate Past Presidents from four of our five clubs in the Knox cluster —Bayswater, Knox, Rowville-Lysterfield and Fern Tree Gully met last week to finalise an outcome for the purchase and presentation of a suitable vehicle for Knox Community Policing. A new quotation had been obtained for a Nissan Tiida at \$14,500. This was considerably cheaper than the model first proposed. However, there was still a \$4,000 shortfall between funds sourced through Sponsors and a District Simplified Grant and those needed to get the vehicle on the road. The clubs agreed to make up this shortfall from club funds, subject to Club Board approvals.

The vehicle will be purchased by the District 9810 Project Funds Ltd., on behalf of the four clubs and the presentation to Knox Police is planned to take place at Rowville-Lysterfield's business breakfast on 11th October.

This high profile project will ensure Rotary's presence in Knox will not go unnoticed. The vehicle will carry suitable Club and Rotary and major sponsorship identification as it travels throughout the Knox area making it easier for the police to carry out important community work.

On Sunday, 14th October, the Melbourne Marathon will be held. I have been contacted by the Cerebral Palsy Education Centre (CEPEC) seeking our Club Members' assistance in providing Marshalling Volunteers. Our role would be the same as last year – handing out medallions at the finish line on the M.C.G.

Looking forward to seeing you all on Monday with a spring in your step!

THE IVAN GIGOVIC BEQUEST

For new members and those who are simply not aware of the history and rules of our bequest....

In August, 2003 Ivan donated to our club his house on Walbundry Avenue, FTG. Subsequently the house was sold and the club realised approximately \$140,000 from the sale.

The club invested the funds and has continued to do so each year since.

In a conversation with John Flemming, just prior to Ivan's demise, John asked Ivan if there was any specific area that he wished the proceeds from the sale of the house and land to be applied. Ivan commented that it would be nice if the money could be used in the overseas (International) area and particularly so if any Croatia projects arose.

Ivan also observed that there were many areas that Rotary International supported and to which they applied funds. In such a situation he felt that his legacy should not be used in those sorts of areas but rather in areas that weren't funded significantly by Rotary International.

It has proven too difficult to correctly identify every project the club has funded with Ivan's money. We have certainly put many thousands of dollars into Operation Cleft, Shelter Box, A milk cow for a village in Uganda, Mosquito Nets in Papua New Guinea, Women in Nepal, and the adoption of a Cambodian family through the Cambodian Children's Trust, etc. etc.

As far as the dollars go, a thumbnail sketch would be:

\$140,000 (for these purposes, calculated at a very conservative rate) earning \$5,000.00 per year over nine years = \$45,000

The principal has also been reduced to \$92,000

Therefore:	\$48,000 (amount the principal has been reduced by)
Plus:	<u>\$45,000</u> (interest earned)
Total	<u>\$93,000</u>

Over the past nine years our club has donated on average, well in excess of \$10,000 per year in overseas aid thanks to Ivan Gigovic.

His death was a sad one but may he rest in peace. His anniversary is in August each year.
