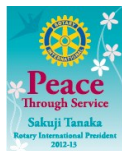

Most people find the subject of banking a trifle dry and dusty. But, talking about the Bendigo Bank's involvement in the community came alive for us as Janine detailed the history of the bank and how it operates in the community today.



Rotary's early emblem was a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust). It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who was an engraver. He designed the emblem to represent both civilization and movement. Most of the early Rotary clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another.

The present emblem, 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted in 1924. A keyway was added to signify usefulness. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 International Convention.

John has been a crime reporter in Melbourne since 1979, moving to The Age in 1993. He has also worked with the Sunday Times insight Team in London, won an ASEAN-AJA scholarship to study crime and corruption in South East Asia and has given evidence at Royal Commission on Police corruption. John has written, edited and published more than 30 crime books—

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The article below is an extract from the Rotary Down Under website, entitled "Meeting Attendance" The Tail That Wags the Rotary Dog? Written by PDG Brent Rosenthal D6690, Southeast Ohio, USA:

Probably every Rotarian who has tried to recruit a new member has at one time or another been rebuffed by someone saying they can't fulfil the meeting attendance requirement. And can anyone even count the number of Rotarians expelled for failing to attend the minimum number of meetings?

I believe good meeting attendance—if not perfect attendance—is important and a noble goal. It builds goodwill and better friendships and is beneficial to all concerned. I just happen to think that Rotarians should attend meetings because they want to and are attracted there—by friends, fun and fellowship—not because we beat them over a head with a rulebook! Also, meeting attendance is an important statistic for club leaders.

A well run Rotary club has meetings and events that members attend because they want to, not because they have to. They participate because they want to spend time with their friends, because the meetings are fun, because of good programs, or especially because they know they will be greeted warmly and made to feel welcome—which is increasingly unusual in our impersonal computer based world!

Almost every Rotarian I know is very busy, with work and family demands and stresses that can be all consuming. But I have found this to be true—Rotarians who feel they are getting value from their membership find time for Rotary meetings and activities. It means something important enough to them to balance out their activities. But those who don't see value from their membership let the other things crowd Rotary out. It's not surprising—we all do the same thing with all of life's activities.

....is your club attractive enough—is it fun, does it provide value to members—to keep members coming to meetings?

Food for thought, I think. What do you think?

At this week's meeting our District Governor, Brian Martin and his wife Sue will be attending. I would like to see all members and partners attending.

Dear fellow Rotarians,

Many of you know that we now have five Avenues of Service in Rotary. The fifth, and newest, is New Generations Service. There are many ways to serve through this avenue, and you will read about some of them in this month's issue.

All of the work we do to educate children, to improve maternal health, to help families live healthier lives – all of this is service to New Generations. We also serve New Generations by working to eradicate polio, helping to ensure that future generations of children will be born into a polio-free world.

Our youth and young adult programs, such as Rotaract, Interact, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, and Rotary Youth Exchange, are a very important part of this Avenue of Service. We must remember that the youth of today are the leaders of tomorrow. By helping to develop young leaders and bringing younger members into our clubs, we strengthen communities – and Rotary's future.

For most of my life, I have been a salesman. I learned long ago that being a good salesman is not enough. You must also have a good product. If you are a good salesman, you will make the first sale. But if you do not have a good product, you will make only the first sale. You will not make the second.

It is not enough to bring new members into Rotary. We want them to stay. We want the new, young members to become longtime members. We want them to be Rotary leaders in 10, 20, or 30 years.

How do we do this? We have to look at our product. We have to look at Rotary not with our own eyes, but with new eyes. When we invite a new member to join and that person's answer is no, we should ask why. This is not to pressure someone into joining. It is to find out more information. What are the obstacles to membership? Is it an inconvenient meeting time? Is it too much of a time commitment? Is it something else that we have not thought of?

We need to ask questions, and we need to open ourselves to the answers. We cannot say, "No, we will not do this," just because we have never done it before. Why not have child care at a meeting? Why not involve families in projects? Why not make attendance requirements less strict, or meet less often?

Our new Avenue of New Generations Service is an important step in ensuring many future generations of Rotary, and of Service Above Self.
