- Acknowledged Julie's work with Youth Exchange
- Explained some aspects of this year's Theme banner:
 - Flowers—*nothing is for ever*
 - Crane—*symbol of peace*
 - Colour—*symbol of nature*
 - Peace is something we hear about every day. On the simplest level peace can be defined as no violence, no fear. Can also be defined as freedom of thought, freedom of choice, life and home in a stable society. Peace can be inner happiness and calm. Rotary helps us to build peace—tolerance of people and nations. Rotary can claim to be world leaders in peace building.
- Presidential Citation—encouraged the club to take part in this.
- Vocational Service is a core value of Rotary—practicing higher ethical standards in business—these things can be applied in Rotary Service.
- *Getting Back to Business* theme (District 9810)
 - members establishing contact with business and marketing the Rotary brand itself. It is essential to membership and is easy marketing and promotion.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Rotary's focus this month (being October), is *Vocational Service* month. Some background on Vocational Service from Rotary's website:

Vocational Service focuses on:

- *Adhering to and promoting the highest ethical standards in all occupations*
- *Recognizing the value of all useful occupations, not just those that are pursued by Rotarians*
- *Contributing one's vocational talents to meeting the needs of the community.*

During October, Rotary clubs are encouraged to focus on this important avenue of Rotary service. Consider dedicating at least one meeting to discussing Vocational Service and plan a project or other activity to carry out through the year.

Membership in Rotary is based on a member's vocation, with each club striving to create a microcosm of its community's business and professional world. This unique feature provides the source for Rotary's historic commitment to vocational service, the second of Rotary's four Avenues of Service. Through vocational service, Rotarians are expected to adhere to and promote high ethical standards in all their business dealings, recognize the worthiness of all useful occupations, and contribute their professional expertise and skills to addressing societal problems and needs.

The club and its members share responsibility for promoting vocational service. Each club should develop projects that allow members to use their business and professional skills. Members are expected to contribute to these projects and to conduct their own business dealings in accordance with Rotary principles.

As it is a committee meeting this Monday I propose to discuss the direction we need to take for our Vocational Service project. *The Peter Wylie Award*. It has been quite some time since we have had suitable applicants to make this award. Maybe a change of direction is needed.

With low numbers of members attending over the past few weeks I hope to see you all at Rotary this week.
