

VOCATIONAL SERVICE AND HIGH ETHICAL STANDARDS

H st to tid fo lit

Historically, Rotarians have promoted the practice of high ethical standards as part of their commitment to vocational service. Two tools developed by Rotarians—The Four-Way Test and the Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions—provide a road map for practicing ethical behaviour in the workplace and other areas of life.

The Four-Way Test

The Four-way Test was conceived in 1932 by Herbert J. Taylor, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who served as the 1954-55 president of Rotary International. Having been assigned the task of saving a company from bankruptcy, Taylor developed the test as an ethical guide to follow in all busi-

ness matters. The company's survival was credited to this simple philosophy. Adopted by Rotary International in 1934, The Four-Way Test remains an essential standard against which Rotarians measure ethical behaviour. The test has been translated into dozens of languages and pro-




