ABCD: Art Building Children's Dreams (Australia) Inc. Fact sheet – Nasavusavu School for Special Education

School background – The Nasavusavu School for Special Education was started in 1991 with 6 students in an old classroom donated by the primary school. The 'new' building was opened in 1994 with help from the Society for Handicapped Children. Currently 38 students attend the school, with ages ranging from 3 to 22. Some travel by bus for up to 2 hours each way. Special needs include bot intellectual and physical disabilities. Some physiotherapy visits are arranged to local villages for those unable to attend school. By far the biggest handicap is a serious and continuing lack of funds, both to help the children attend the school and to provide equipment and learning materials and to maintain and improve the accommodation.

Support required – The cost of caring for a child at this school is a heavy burden on the parents of very limited income. In addition to the cost of schooling there is the increasing cost of caring for the disability as the child grows and requires more help. There are at least 20 children identified as a priority need for financial support to continue to attend this very special school, which is essential to ensure they have the best possible opportunity for development. There are also opportunities to extend this project to help improve facilities and buildings.

Cost of Education for one year – Estimated at FJ\$360 = AU\$200. ABCD standard child sponsorship at AU\$250 per child will therefore fully cover the cost of that child's education for one year and make a good contribution to the general fund for school stationery and supplies which will benefit all the children in the school.

Below is an excerpt from an email received from Tania deHoon of the Rotary Club of Savusavu. (Host club in Fiji).


Thank you for the fantastic news!

As soon as I receive the ABCD Project Agreement from Ken, I will get everything underway at this end.

Just this morning I was given some crayons, colouring pencils and paper to pass on to local children who could put the supplies to good use. I can't think of a better use than the 4 children at the Spec. Ed. School using the art supplies to draw their dreams for RC Fern Tree Gully & ABCD.

Lily also attended the ANZAC Day ceremony and found it had a solomn impact on her. As here social experience she attended the ballet—Swan Lake. As she loves dancing she found this to her liking and learned how ballet improves health, fitness and technical ability.

Nikite: Learned how to make a number of desserts (Cooking skill), visited a nursing home where she helped the residents. Her cultural experience was to visit a Sri Lanken home and participate in a meal. She also visited a Greek Orthodox Church to celebrate Easter.

Zoe: Helped to coach the Under 11 Netball Team; She was obviously successful as they presented her with a card and roses on the presentation night. Zoe also attended a play and met the cast.

Nori: Did Physical Recreation—played soccer and scored the first goal for the season. She attended a Chinese Festival and saw the famous dragons. For her social sector she visited the National Gallery.

All the students showed an impressive array of exhibits as part of their presentations.

There being no further business President Graeme thanked everyone for coming, read out the housekeeping and birthdays and closed the meeting.

This is an opportunity for our club to not only provide financial support but, once we make contact with the projects host club—RC of Savusavu—we may be able to also provide some material support for them.

On Saturday Enid and I attended the Upper Ferntree Gully Fire Brigade's 86th Annual Dinner and presentation night. On behalf of the club it was my pleasure to present two cheques—to Upper FTG and Ferntree Gully Fire Brigades in the amount of \$6850.00—the proceeds of our recent intersection collection. In the last eight years we have collected in excess of \$90,000 for which we were thanked by the CFA Chief Officer.

Also in attendance was the Mayor Elect of Knox, Karen Orpen, who reminded me that it was she who came to our club during Fran's year as President and sought our support for the CFA fundraising opportunity. I took the opportunity to invite her to again attend one of our meetings during her year as Mayor.

One of the many presentations made to brigade members was a very special one to Mark Goodchild. Mark was awarded the National Medal for Service. A medal that has been recognised by Queen Elizabeth II, for volunteers in the community. Judging by his service record to the brigade Mark is a very worthy recipient.
