## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We again have been contacted by Peter Maldon, Boronia Rotary looking for assistance in packing hampers next week for Knox Community Christmas Support Project. This would suit some of our retired members. I will have day, time and location details at our meeting tonight. KCCS is a project of Knox Info Link supporting those in need in our community at Christmas.

Below is an excerpt of an email sent by Chris Potter (our last year's AG), to Tony Monley (this year's AG). Three very worthy projects—I'm looking to find out how club members think on this.

*There are three current things we are considering.*

- Off the back of the funding we received from the Knox Clubs for the infrastructure changes to enable us to establish a Youth Service at Knox Ozone, the whole area of youth health and mental health has been put on the map and this has been a major contributor to Knox being chosen as the site for a Headspace Centre in the Outer East. The Centre, which is also to be based at Ozone, is to open early in the new year but there is a significant shortfall in terms of the equipment budget provided and the potential cost – well in excess of \$100,000. We are not seeking to fill that gap completely but I was wondering whether a proposal in outline could be put to the 5 Knox clubs to see if they were prepared to build further on their generous contribution and help assist with equipment to enable the full and effective running of this vital service. This ticks a number of boxes for Rotary in respect of community partnership, youth service and mental health focus. I can provide a lot more detail in due course in respect of equipment requirements but wondered if you could float the concept first – maybe this could be done in partnership with the Bendigo Bank as well as has been done in some other areas or maybe could attract a DSG if money was still available.*
- Mental Health First Aid – this has been tried and tested in Manningham with the Rotary Club of Doncaster and I know some of this is provided through Eastern Health and Knox City Council – but I believe we could build on this and extend the partnership to Community Health, Medicare Locals, and Rotary – again just flagging the concept to be raised.*
- The third one is around a playgroup in Bayswater that is having its funding withdrawn by Playgroup Victoria – this will impact on a child health innovations project we are currently running and we were wondering whether Rotary would consider funding this in partnership with us – I think we were talking about a \$6000 cost for a play group facilitator. Again can provide more detail as required.*

### A Gift that Gives Twice

In developing countries where health care and other social services are poor to non-existent, raising a child with a disability presents a significant burden to the whole family. Without a wheelchair a child can be housebound and a burden for a carer, usually the mother.

The gift of a wheelchair gives twice. It not only presents the child with freedom but also frees the mother to work and contribute to the family's income. Your contribution to WFK contributes directly to a needy child receiving a wheelchair.



Many people have contributed to the development of our wheelchairs, from the original old bike frame model, to a steel model, then to aluminium and the present Model 9 designed for rough terrain with a strong steel subframe and puncture proof tyres. The wheelchair has recently been re-designed to WHO recommendations. However, its greatest feature being complete adjustability to suit the different sizes and growing needs of children. Adjustable Postural Support Devices are also made freely available to assist the large number of recipients with cerebral palsy. The package also contains a knitted knee rug, a multi layered cushion, a tool kit and a few spares.

Your 'Wishes in the Well' have provided many wheelchairs in the past. For your generosity we thank you.
