

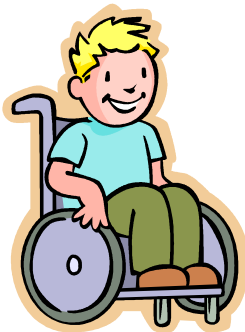


WHEELCHAIRS FOR KIDS

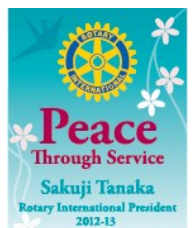

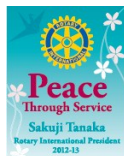

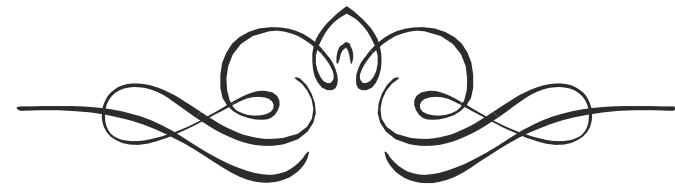
PROGRAM: A YEAR IN GERMANY—Damien Croke

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On Saturday evening Enid, Julie and I attended the *Welcome Home Dinner* for our District's recently returned Youth Exchange Students. Families and Rotarians from all the clubs who sponsored the eleven students made for a large gathering to hear each student give a brief (5 minutes) presentation of the 12-months exchange experience. As FTG members know from listening to past students, it was a life changing experience for all students.

As in Damien Croke's presentation to our club last week, he spoke about some of the ups and downs he experienced during his time in Germany, and how he learned to overcome those issues. His talk certainly held the interest of those in attendance. Again, well done Damien.

Last week I mentioned the District was seeking part funding from clubs to support the construction of a 17-bed Children's Family Home in Timor Leste. This project would be the second project undertaken by the District in partnership with Box Hill TAFE. It includes the completion (to lock-up stage) of a Community House. The total cost of this project is \$72,000 and District 9810 clubs are being asked to contribute \$25,000 with the remainder being funded by private donors. (\$30,000 have already been confirmed).

Proposed Project Partners include:

- Yooralla Overseas Development Fund—for project design and building materials
- Box Hill TAFE—building apprentices and supervision
- Philanthropic Funding Partners
- District 9810

As we still have some money available in our Benevolent Fund for an international project of this type, I feel we should consider supporting this worthwhile project.

Rowville-Lysterfield Rotary Club are again hosting a Business Breakfast on 18th April. Mr **Brett Clothier** has been confirmed as the keynote speaker. As many of you will know, Brett's title is *AFL Manager—Integrity Services* and it was he who led the investigation into the "tanking" claims against the Melbourne Football Club. He will also be heading up the current dealings with Essendon. Should be good to listen to. More details later but if you'd like to attend, please let me know.
