



As requested by DG Brian Martin, below is a special notice from Michael Reynolds:

### To whom it may concern,

I am writing to you today as a Monash Rotaract member of District 9810 and as a researcher in Bipolar Disorder and genetics. Our particular interest is in identifying endophenotypes, the expression of neurocognitive and social cognitive enhancements or deficits, which will aid in identifying specific genes. Identifying genes will greatly aid in creating novel treatment for those people suffering bipolar disorder, both immediately as techniques for psychotherapy may be developed and long-term as new genetic markers will lead to novel pharmacotherapy options.

In association with Swinburne University, Monash University and the Alfred Hospital, we have particular interest in this gap in the literature, which we intend to address with this project. These benefits for treatment in Bipolar Disorder will aid in improving functional, occupational, social interactions and daily living.

We would like to recruit First Degree relatives (eg siblings or offspring) of those people suffering bipolar disorder but do not have the disorder themselves. Participation involves completing an array of cognitive and emotional tasks in addition to a survey and an interview. We also require a blood sample for genetic analysis. The cognitive battery includes testing your executive functioning abilities, attention, working memory and more. Everything is confidential and participation is voluntary. You will also be paid \$50 for your time once you have completed the interview, cognitive battery, survey, and provided a genetic sample.

**PROGRAM: BUINNINGS—CRAIG BLEKSLEY**

Greg gave us an interesting rundown on the history of Bunnings—established in 1866 as a business predominantly in W.A. . They purchased McEwans (Victoria) in 1993 and, since 1994 have opened a new store on average every 3 months.

Bunnings is owned by Wesfarmers who have a turnover of \$59 billion. The Bunnings share of this is \$8 billion.

The Scoresby store occupies 13,000 sq. mtrs; has 190 team members; \$45 million turnover; hold \$6.5 million of stock; serve between 16-22 thousand customers per week and consider themselves as part of the community—*"We live here too"*.

At the national level, 42 thousand community events across the country are supported with \$27 million. The Scoresby store have a budget of \$35,000 per year for "good causes". They have a "green" action group in all stores and support the reducing of landfill, recycling, and harvest their own water.

Bunnings budget a 9% loss in sales to the recently opened Masters store but have lost on 4% so far.

To coincide with the introduction of the Future Vision program a new format has been endorsed—“*Learning and Development*”. The major differences are:

- To encourage clubs to work *collaboratively* (when appropriate) rather than *individually* (multi-club projects).
- Shift the emphasis from *Training* to *Learning and Development*.

Breakout sessions will comprise the cluster clubs meeting together in facilitated sessions to take a holistic view of programs, projects and activities of District 9810 effectively requiring all members of our club's committee chairs for 2013/14 to attend.

Specialised breakouts will be conducted for Secretaries, Treasurers, Membership Chairs and New Members.

Benefits of the revised Assembly format include:

- Large clubs can identify opportunities to work with smaller clubs to collaborate on Global and District Grand Projects;
- Rotarians can see all programs and activities in one Assembly session;
- Gaps in Rotary knowledge can be identified;
- Clubs set the pace in each breakout session, identifying ways of addressing the needs of local and international communities;
- Raising the overall knowledge base of Rotarians in the District.

I am sure President Elect Phil will be encouraging all his Board members to attend this new learning format Assembly.


### Great Community Raffle
