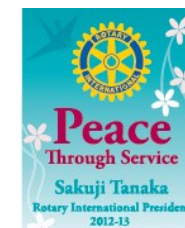

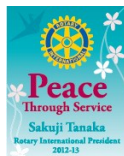

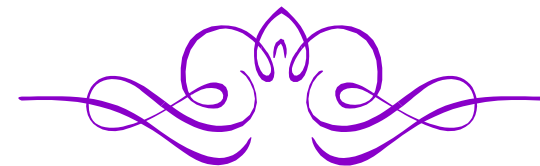
However, the following specialised break-outs will be conducted:

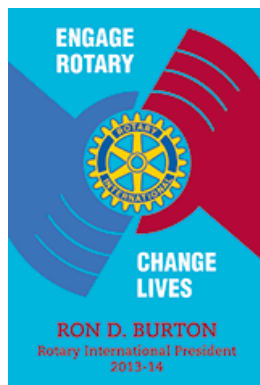
- Club Secretaries

- New Members with less than 12 months experience in a Rotary Club

The benefits of the revised Assembly format are significant and include:

- 1) Large clubs (with large budgets) can identify opportunities to work with smaller clubs (and smaller budgets) to collaborate on Global Grant and District Grant projects;
- 2) Rotarians can see all programs and activities in our District in one Assembly session rather than take many years, by attending one specific breakout each year under the previous format.
- 3) Gaps in Rotary knowledge can be identified and follow-up (demand driven) "how to" seminars designed to close gaps.
- 4) Clubs set the pace in each cluster break-out session, identifying ways of addressing the needs of local and international communities, driving the discussion agenda about what they need to know, (rather than listening to lectures about Rotary processes).
- 5) Raising the overall knowledge base of many Rotarians in the District, versus raising their knowledge of one specific aspect of Rotary.
- 6) Using graduates of the Rotary Leadership Institute to facilitate learning and development at Assembly creates an experienced pool of talent from which to select future Rotary leaders.

Clubs that choose to work individually can still do so under the new format, gaining a lot from attending Assembly by learning new 'tips and tricks' from successful clubs in their cluster.





District Assembly – Sunday 19th May 2013

The District 9810 Assembly for 2013 will be held on Sunday 19th May at Deakin University, 221 Burwood Road, Burwood (Melway 61 B5 – enter off Holland Avenue). There will be signs and guides available directing attendees to car parking and to the registration area.

The registration desk will open at 8.00 am and tea and coffee will be available. The Assembly will start at 8.45 am and finish by 1:00 pm.

The Presidents Elect (PE) 2013/14 and Presidents Nominee PN 2014/15 are invited to separate lunches (1.00 pm – 2.15 pm) convened by Governor Elect Merv Ericson and Kay and Governor Nominee Tony Monley and Kathy.
