


Note the Blue Zones" (Google it) - a concept used to identify a demographic and/or geographic area of the world where people live measurably longer lives.

Foster health:

• Service 750,000 people]	Child & Youth
• 90,000 staff]	Adult
• \$760 m. budget]	Aged

Treat around 2,000 "clients" at any one time

Assess 6,000-7,000 emergency 'clients' each year.

Mental Health:

Seems to be increasing—1,000,000 in 2009—1,100,000 in 2019 (10% increase in 10 years).100,000 of these are in Eastern Health Region.

National Recovery Model

- Changing the focus on the treatment of mental health
- Patient identified recovery
- A fundamental shift to care

Mental Health Act Changes

- To "modernize" treatment options
- Will give more control to patients and less 'mandatory' care

Depression

- One of the most common illnesses
- WHO rank as 4th on the most urgent health problem; expected to be No. 1 by 2020.
- 120 million worldwide have major depression
- Australia's most debilitating illness
- More than just feeling "down" and may last for several weeks or months.

Symptoms

- Change in sleep patterns
- Change in appetite or weight
- Change in sex drive
- Decreased energy levels
- Reduced motivation
- Poor concentration/energy
- Low self-esteem
- Less ability to control emotions
- Anxiety, loss of interest in usual activities
- Most undiagnosed and/or poorly treated
- At risk <45
- Single/recurrent episodes
- 5-10% of populations at any one time
- Lethal condition—10-20% fatal (by suicide)

Causes

- Biological—genetic/hormonal/biochemical
- Sociological
- Psychological

An excellent presentation that evoked deep thought and many questions and comments.



On Saturday evening we will celebrate our 50th Anniversary Dinner with a “Sixties” theme. Unfortunately there has been a disappointing response from former members of the club as far as attending this evening. Having followed up many of our more recent members we have not managed to increase the numbers. However, those past and/or honorary members who will be there will be given a warm welcome.

May is Australian Rotary Health Month. Rotary clubs and Districts will, this month, celebrate the largest national, multi-District project they have embarked on in Australia. Over 210 countries in the world have Rotary organisations and Australia is the only one to have, and name, its own health fund.

Australian Rotary Health has been funding research into SIDS, Bowel Cancer, Breast Cancer, Motor Neuron Disease, Diabetes and a variety of other health areas for over 31 years—expending \$31 million in the process. In 2000 they directed funds into Mental Health research as 45% of the Australian population will suffer a mental health difficulty during their lifetime and mental illnesses are now the leading cause of the non-fatal disease burden in our country.
