PROGRAM: KING GAN—CAMBODIA TODAY—RURAL POVERTY

Dr Gan spoke on

- Project Cham Resh Report—Health
 - All families now have access to water. 25 wells and 5 deep bores have been installed and every family has a water filter and mosquito nets.
- Homestead Food Production
 - The last phase of the project is a homestead food production program for 20 poor families with severely malnourished children. A drip irrigation model called the "Chapin bucket kit" will be implemented
- Mushroom Farming
 - An exciting agricultural development at Cham Resh is the mushroom production program. A specially designed "mushroom growing shed" was built in the school compound and now produces mushrooms for the school feeding program. The children have been taught how to grow the mushrooms and help in the project by packing the mushroom bags. Mushroom growing also has the potential to generate income.

Education:

- One of the most outstanding areas of achievement is in the area of education.
 250 students now attend the school with a staff comprising a full-time principal and 5 teachers.
 16 students have graduated to middle school, which was an impossibility 4 years.
- Economic Development
 - Building the 3.7 km road linking Cham Resh to the next village (Chab Smach)
 has made an incredible improvement to the lives of the villages. It has given
 them the opportunity to commute to town for business, health and personal
 reasons. It has increased the land value and resulted in economic activity
 within the village itself, with small shops opening up and new houses being
 built.
- Harmony Building
 - Visits by monk counselors to the village to speak with the school students and the villages have made a great contribution to the overall success of the project. While domeastic violence is still an issue in the village, as it is Cambodia wide, there are fewer violent families than before.
- Where To Now:
 - Even though project Cham Resh is phasing out, the homestead food production program and education will be monitored so the people of Cham Resh are not left entirely alone.

There was much interest and questions generated from Dr. Gan's presentation.

SPONSORED STUDENTS—NASAVUSAVU SPECIAL ED. SCHOOL



Daiana Dagaga—born 27th August, 2005

Daiana is the second eldest of four sisters. She has cerebral Palsy and is 7 years old. Daiana travels in and out of school using the public transport. She uses a wheel chair and a walker in school to move around but otherwise she crawls everywhere—to the slide, sweeping and playing. She wears a diaper and has been encouraged to use pegs if she needs to go to the toilet. She understands also what she has been told but finds it difficult to answer. She either points to the key words or signs them. She drools a lot when eating but is able to feed herself.

Rotary Club of Fern Tree Gully has been assigned the project of sponsoring the Special Education Students attending the Nasavusavu primary school and already has four students. Diana has been sponsored by Julie and Mark Goodchild.

We have the opportunity of sponsoring four more students. Already three are spoken for and the fourth is about to be awarded.
