Warwick has been married 33 years with 4 children. He has a social media background. He was also the recipient of a liver transplant 24 years ago, after contracting a very rare virus. He received the liver of a 19 year old girl who had been killed and through that gift has lived

FROM "OUR GIRL" IN DENMARK.....

In the last couple of weeks I have moved family and decided to go and do all my visa paper work myself seeing as my councilor was never going to catch on. So as soon as I got my letter saying that I was a legal resident in Denmark I needed to go to two services. One to get a social security number (CPR number) and the other was the police station to get my residence card and my bio metrics taken (a photo and finger prints). I went to the police station because it was open 9am till 12pm. unfortunately I thought it opened at 8am, and was waiting an hour for it to open.. but I was first in line!

After walking in the police station I found out I was meant to go to the other service first! except it was only open Tuesdays and Thursdays 12pm til 4pm... So I went back to school for a class. and then went to the other service to get my CPR number, luckily, that one was easier to get, I just showed my passport and my papers and a few clicks on the computer and she gave me a number!

I returned back to the police station the next morning and the numbers on the screen and tickets where wrong, so me going next almost caused a all out riot between this other lady who was yelling Danish to me, but I survived. They took my photo and finger prints and because my residence card wouldn't arrive for another 3 or so weeks and I am going on my Eurotour in a week I needed to also apply for a re-entry permit into Denmark, (just so I was safe and wont get stopped at the border, it was better to be safe than sorry) so I filled out all the paperwork for that and applied, but they took my passport, so they could put the visa into it. They said it would take a week to do, and then I can have my passport back.

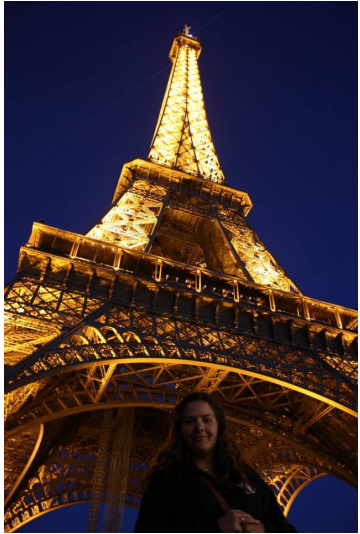
Except! seeing as I now had a CPR I was meant to open a Bank account, which is hard to do when the only 'legal' ID I had on me was my Australian learners permit, and because it was not an EU licence, they didn't except it, so that was a hour of my life wasted at the bank... their wasn't even free candy!

When I went to my Rotary meeting on Monday, my counselor asked me if I revived my residence card yet, and when I said 'No..' He said 'We will have to make sure we get it before you leave next week', so I told him about my Visa that I applied for so I could leave the country.

I went to the bank today with my grandfather and opened an account, all they needed was a photo copy of my passport, (Something which I actually have!) and they were much nicer to me, because My grandfather was a big share holder in the bank, he just walked in like he owned the place (which I have to admit was pretty cool) oh and this place had a hot chocolate machine and free lollies! Anyway I just have to get my passport back, (hopefully tomorrow) and then pack my bags and I am ready for Eurotour! and also completely legal!
