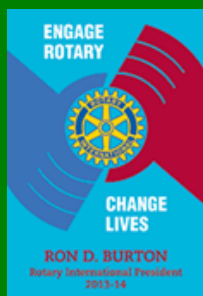

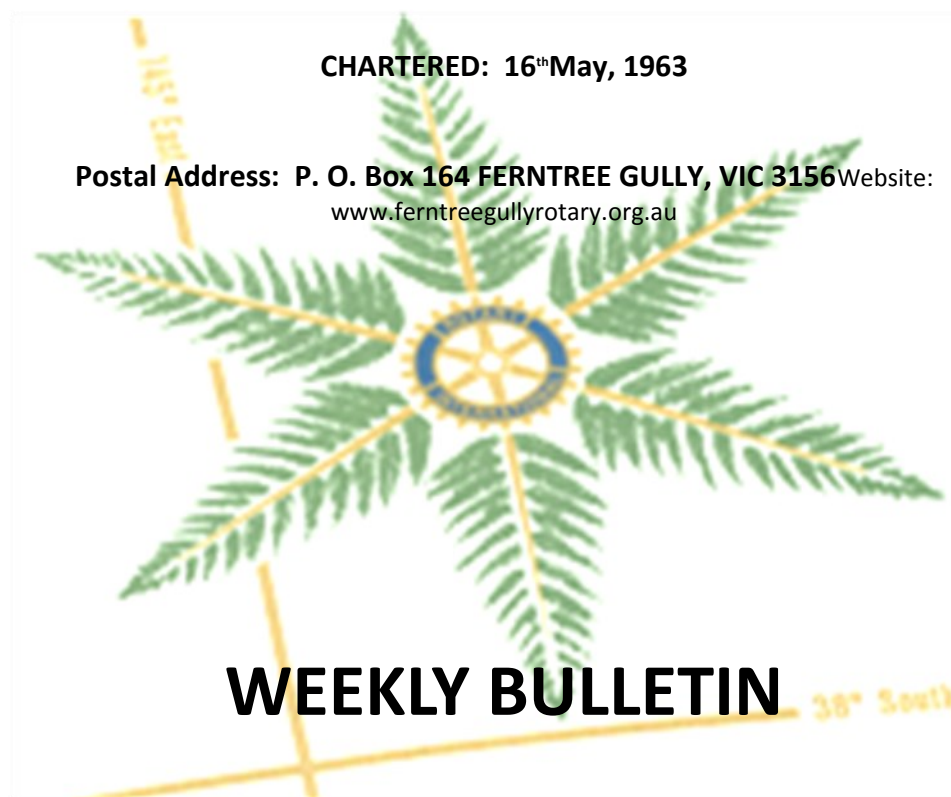

FOUNDATION

At a recent international Convention in Lisbon, it was announced that the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation will continue to further support Rotary's Polio Eradication efforts with further funding over the next five years.

The nuts and bolts of this are, the Rotary Clubs of the world will need to raise US\$35million **per year** over the next five years. **Each year**, for the next five years, the Gates Foundation will match this US\$35 million in the ratio of two dollars for every one dollar that the Rotary Clubs of the world raise. What a great return on investment; sure beats quantitative easing.

Stepping back to 1985, Rotarians made a promise to the then children of the world, that we would work towards eradicating the polio virus and that no more children would suffer from this debilitating disease. *From a thousand cases per day then, and as of June 19 this year there has only been sixty nine cases reported thus far this year.*

We are succeeding in the eradication effort and however, to continue to succeed, we still need financial support. For our District to achieve its goal, as well as achieving your Club polio giving goal we will be looking for Aus\$35.00 per capita from your Club and or Club members which will be matched in due course at 2:1 from the Gates Foundation. *A whopping \$105.00 for a \$35.00 investment which in turn will immunize around two hundred children.*

PROGRAM:

Heart Health - Dr. Gishel New (Eastern Health)

Every day in Australia 40 men and 30 women die from heart attacks. It is so important that if you have chest pains for 20 minutes you immediately call 000 and request an ambulance. You then take an aspirin and wait to be picked up. Under no circumstances do you try to take yourself to hospital.

Chest pains are given priority 1 by Ambulance Victoria so you won't have a long wait.

The difference between heart attack and Angina is that one or more arteries are totally blocked with a heart attack. Angina is when one or more arteries are partially blocked.

Risk factors for heart attack:

- Age
- Gender
- Family history
- Smoking
- High blood pressure
- High Cholesterol
- Obesity

Dr. New gave a very informative talk and her message needs to be taken notice of, especially the most important aspect for heart health—to exercise at least 30 minutes every day.
