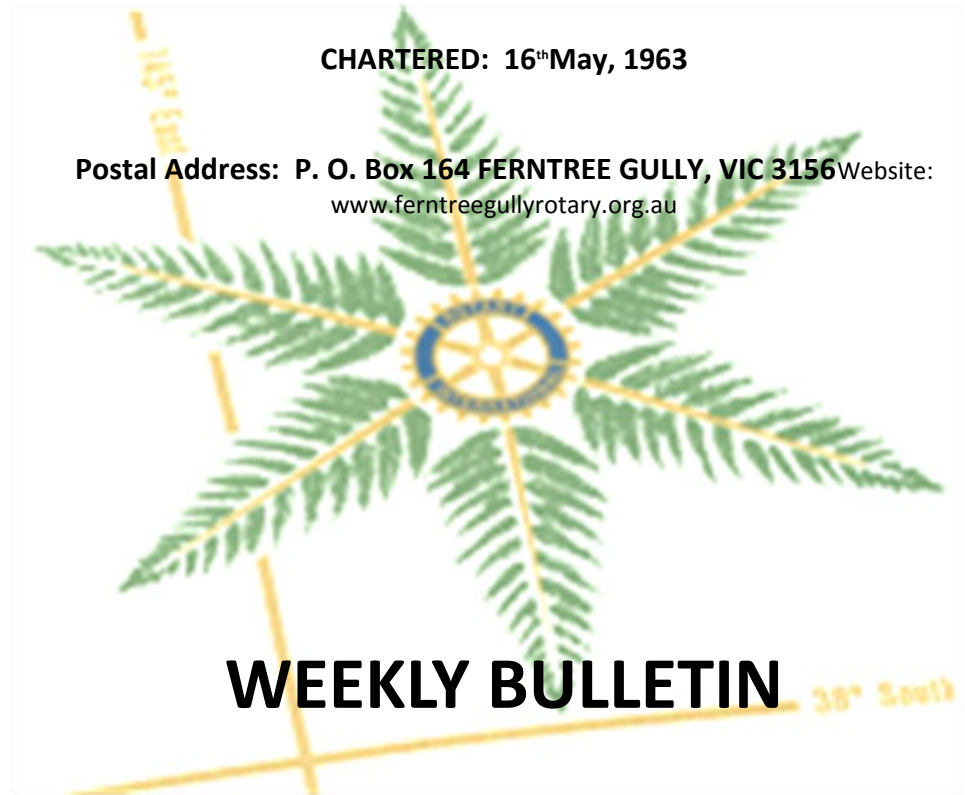

RYLA EXPERIENCE

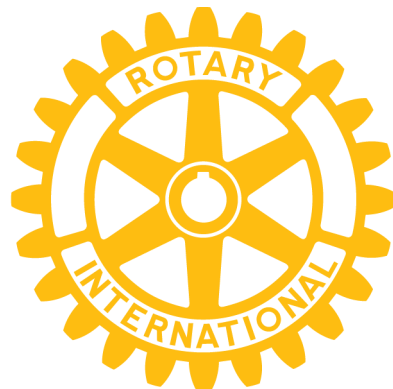

PROGRAMME: RYLA EXPERIENCE

Guest Speakers Jo Wilson and Mitchell O'Hara-Wild respectively spoke about their experiences at the District RYLA camp.

RYLA is a 6 day intensive leadership course at which participants undergo challenges and activities that extend them both physically, mentally and emotionally, including guest speaking, discussions, team building, etc.

Participants came from various walks of life and mostly were strangers to one another at the start. Not staying within the safety net of the same group for all activities was encouraged

and was soon embraced by the youths attending.

JO WILSON : Did not know what to expect from the camp but soon became intensely involved and found herself stretched and tested on many levels. She also bonded easily with other participants she had never met before.

Also found herself going outside her comfort zone on several occasions.

The programme also aims to encourage self-development, as well as leadership skills.

Jo was amazed at the difference she felt in herself at the end of her RYLA week, and asked the club to not only encourage other people to participate, but to continue to support the programme financially, as a most worthy and life-changing project that some people may never otherwise have the chance to experience – and grow as a worthy member and leader of the community.

MITCHELL: Is a member of Monash Rotaract Club. Most members of that club have previously attended RYLA and Mitchell was encouraged to attend as a result of the advice from some of those members.

Mitchell told the club a particularly memorable task he was set was to organise an end of camp concert – a field he had never undertaken before in any way - and with only a very short notice period.

He took up the challenge, albeit nervously at first and feeling the pressure of having to organise the other Ryla participants to take part in the show.

He also decided to write a song about RYLA itself and the experiences of the week and, with the other members of the concert, performed the song to great acclaim.

When leaving the camp members are encouraged to record their opinions of the experience in a book. Those comments have helped Mitchell to improve his feelings at the times when he is dispirited.

Both Jo and Mitchell are now looking to improve their leadership skills, and to make a positive difference to the community in their individual ways.

They gladly responded to questions from the floor.

HAT DAY—The meeting was then presented with the winners of the "best hat" competition – Graham Faulkner being a worthy runner up with his very newsworthy, home-made effort, and Paul Mc. Was chosen as the winner with his "birthday party" hat.

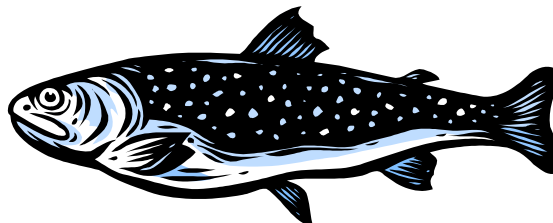
