
We are fortunate to have a great ADG and an active Cluster..the rest is up to us.

PROGRAMME:

Guest speaker PP Merv Lincoln spoke on "Working In The Prison System"

Opening comments were on how he had to change his epaulettes by removing indication of rank and replacing them with a "cross" and wears a special purple jacket and cap so that prisoners can readily differentiate him from the prison warders. They refer to him as the "Purple M&M".

Some of his comments:

- Because of the empathy he has been able to develop with the inmates he feel safer when walking around prison than he does in a shopping centre like "Knox City"
- Started as the Padre for three prisons but now only visits two as one of them was Ararat and he had problems developed with his visits there.
- He told a wonderful story about how the inmates are taught to relate to their families particularly young children, by being taught to care for "eggs and bears" that represent embryos and babies.

All in all it was an incredible tale of life in the prison system, he had some unbelievable stories, all far too numerous to attempt to relate here other than to say it was one of the most interesting talks at a Rotary evening that I've heard for many years. I don't think anybody cared that it ran well over time. (I certainly didn't)






