

- Issues to promote partnerships, e.g. with the Gates Foundation.
- Reaches approx. 300,000 people.
- All senior staff are Rotarians.
- A Club directory is also maintained as well as a business directory and speakers list.
- RDU Merchandise is privately owned and pay franchise fees to RDU.
- Questions related to:
 - the life of the print edition (as distinct from digital version);
 - the travel and life sections of the mag.
 - The age groups of readers
 - Is the format attracting young people?

Jenny's husband Roger took the opportunity to urge members to attend the Rotary International Convention which will be in Sydney on 1-4th June. A really good show. Sydney public transport will be free for the entire period.






