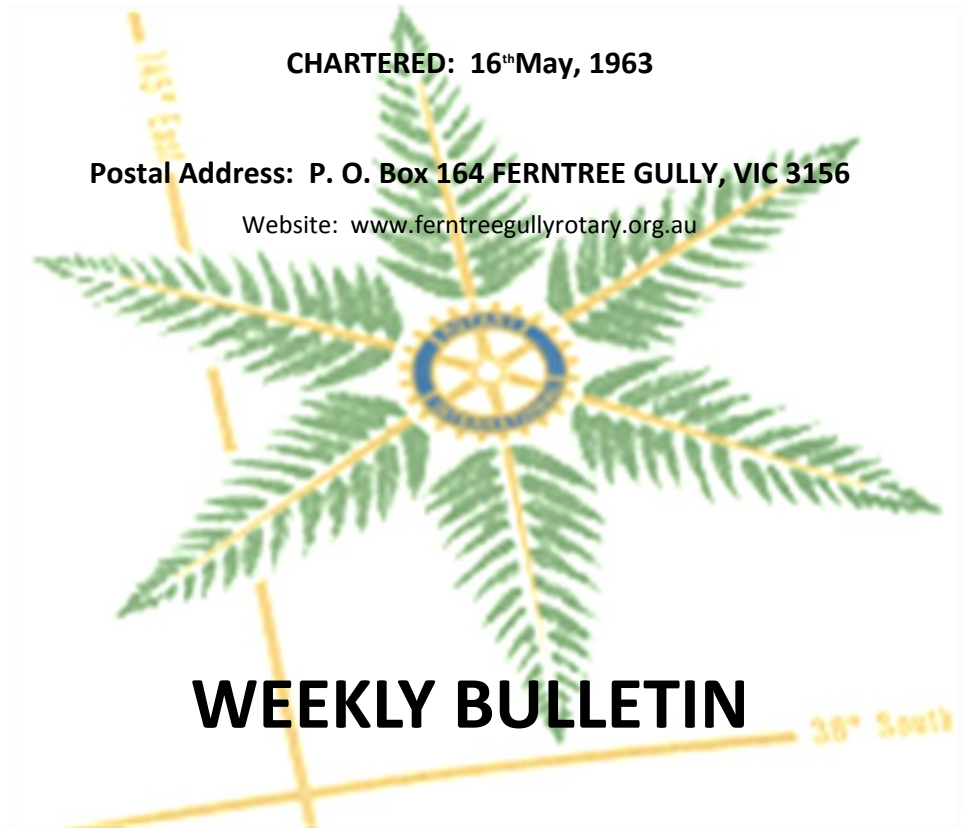

Since 1999 the Communist Party has been brutally persecuting Falun Gong followers.

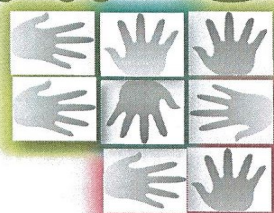
Chinese culture is being revitalised through Chinese dancing. Chinese dancing is one of the most impressive art forms in the world.
