

PROGRAM: Darren Kenos OIC Intelligence Unit Knox
Knox Community Policing

Knox crime has increased 9% in the past year.

Crime: Darren spoke on what is driving our crime.

- One quarter of overall offences are petrol drive offs.

- Employee thefts are also large.
- Theft of number plates is large, these are used in drive offs and freeway charge fraud.
- Most property damage is to vehicles in car parks.

Intelligence: Police information is focused into these areas.

- Offender
- Victim
- Location

- Information from Crime Stoppers helps to forecast trends, reoccurring offenders carry out 80% of offences, they are referred to local support services.
- Areas are mapped, letter drops are carried out in high risk burglary areas.
- Most assaults are outside the home and the offender is known to the victim.
- In 12 months residential burglaries have reduced by 17%. Overall the City of Knox is a fairly safe environment in which to live.

Much interest was shown on these very interesting statistics followed by many questions.

There was no further business, President Phil announced next week's guest speakers were from Southern Cross Kids Club, and wished Mike Spike a Happy Birthday.


