

Guest Speaker: Len Brear

In 1983 the Rotary Club of Cheltenham instigated the Interplast concept in Australia within the then Rotary Dist 980 [now 9800]. Its intentions were to repair bodies and rebuild lives in the Asia Pacific region.


Interplast became a joint project between Rotary and the Royal College of Surgeons providing medical teams to carry out plastic and reconstructive surgery in developing countries performing surgeries for cleft lip, palate and burn trauma injuries.

Today the focus is more on training with the value of service being in excess of \$2 mil throughout the Pacific Region

Rotary has provided up to \$500,000 in funding with the balance coming company's and trust donations. Rotary's funding Australia wide has dropped to less than \$250,000. 16 clubs within our District have not contributed in the past 6 years. The objective this year is to raise \$46,000 for a surgical team and a training team to travel overseas. To date, Interplast has visited 25 countries, performed 21,000 operations and conducted 37,000 consultations, 180 volunteer surgeons have donated their time. In conclusion Len asked the club to consider Interplast in their donation giving.

There being no further business Pres Mike thanked Len Brear, and with no announcements the meeting was closed at 8.35pm.
