





Celebrating 10 years of incorporation Captain Eric still thinks of CHIPS as a "new" charity in our "Culture helping in Schools". They currently have over 400 volunteers helping kids in trauma and are moving into the Knox area.

Part of what they do is to educate people in what happens when people experience trauma:

- Freeze
- Runs
- Fights
- Fail state

CHIPS deals with all four stages offering support in these areas only working in primary schools though.

Kids in trauma are in "animal" state and so do not understand any logic. They can only associate emotionally. CHIPS uses "fun" offering value and hope.

Have been doing this for 10 years and most volunteers are past participants.

In closing, Eric expressed his desire to have us (as volunteers), rather than a donation.

There being no further business Pres. Mike read out the housekeeping duties for next week. Announced the birthdays and then closed the meeting.



On behalf of the Knox Anzac Memorial Committee, I would like to invite you and your members to the official unveiling and dedication of the Knox Honour Roll Memorial on November 1st. This date marks 100 years since the first Australian ship set sail for the First World War.

The memorial will contain the names of all the defence force members from our local area who have lost their lives serving our nation. It also contains informative panels of the major battles that Australia has participated in.

The former Governor General, Major General the Hon Michael Jeffery, AC, AO (Mil), CVO, MC (Ret'd) will officially open the Roll.

This memorial is the outcome of two years of work by the Committee, which consists of local veterans associations, the Knox Council, and Knox Historical Society as myself as Chair. I was pleased to secure \$200,000 of federal funding (an election commitment) for the project.

The official ceremony begins at **2pm** sharp, **Sat Nov 1st, 2014** at the **Tim Neville Arboretum in Ferntree Gully**.

**We hope you and your friends are able to join us on this special occasions.**
