





We have decided to redefine our role as a cluster, and do more at the cluster level on a more regular basis. For starters, we will be organizing the District Youth seminar in February as a cluster – I will advise more of this soon. One such is RAM (Rotary Against Malaria) which is getting back its due emphasis after having been overshadowed by our world-wide Polio push for the last decade – it still affects 2 million annually in 100 countries, mostly around the Equator and especially in our region. We have a special interest in this project as Ken Thomson, our last charter member, was a PNG survivor from WWII and wanted something done for the people of the area. An annual donation to the RAM fund could be a great way of honouring Ken's efforts for our Club and Rotary.

I'll report more on the District meeting in next week's musings.

## SPEAKER MEETING NIGHTS


