



St John

- One of Gonzalo's subjects was *How to act if you get injured*. The need is to get a person treated ASAP.
- Burns—cool water is the best initial treatment.
- Embers travel a long way and people get burns in their neck, and clothing, openings. *Prepare!*"
- Fires exacerbate shock and problems such as asthma. Be aware of people's appearance to see if they need help. Keep the feet up when people have these problems.
- Asthma is a major problem in Melbourne (8 deaths per week—used to be 20).
- Diabetics have problems healing so burns can cause

major problems. So focus your plans on family members who have specific health problems.

- Water is a major help but not with children—"Cool the wound, warm the person". Water does not have to be really cold but poured on the wound area for 20 minutes.
- The message—with a burn, keep it cool and cover it up (with something that won't stick, ie non-stick bandages or gladwrap).
- Sunburn—cold water is best. Aloe Vera and Manuka Honey are also apparently helpful but water is the initial recommendation.
- Blood consistency, if on medication, can be a problem so water is necessary for drinking. (Blood pressure can also be affected).
- Water can be effective for 3 hours if necessary
- 42% of people in car accidents die from asphyxiation (due to their head dropping/ neck wounds).

Many questions were asked.

President Mike thanked Gonzalo for speaking to the club, read out the housekeeping for the coming week, then closed the meeting at 8:35pm.


