





Last Monday night Ferntree Gully members were treated to a very special evening looking and listening to Brian's presentation on the history of Fern Tree Gully.



Ferntree Gully was originally part of an outstation established by Rev. Clow in 1840. Settled during that decade, by the 1870s selectors enjoyed the facilities provided by two hotels and a post office. Further eastwards timber-cutters were penetrating the forest, and a school was built in 1880 to meet local needs. Soon a bakery, a butchery and Wesleyan and Anglican churches were built. On 30 May 1889 the Shire of Fern Tree Gully was proclaimed, consisting of 390 sq km severed from the Berwickshire. Its population was 750.

PROGRAM: HISTORY OF FERN TREE GULLY & DISTRICT.
Bill Ireland

Bill spoke on the history of Ferntree Gully :

- James Clow was the first white settler; there was also Eugene Gerrard (famous artist) and Thomas Dobson.
- Spoke of the The Club Hotel, the Middle and the Royal. The Middle was built circa 1860 but was preceded by a beer shanty. The present Middle Hotel was built in the 1930's (1880 the original hotel).
- Fern Tree Gully was a popular place for Melburnians to visit or camp. 1889 saw the first train to FTG (originally the train was to come from Oakleigh but a policeman owned land further north (where FTG now is) and the eventual township was therefore north of the original intended site.
- 26 trains ran on Easter Thursday, 1926—FTG—Belgrave (Puffing Billy). FTG was obviously a popular place to visit.
- Showed early photos of the Education Centre and the National Park.
- Prior to the Shire of Fern Tree Gully it was part of the Shire of Berwick. In 1963 it became the Shire of Knox and in 1964 the City of Knox.
- In 1894 the Shire Hall was opened (part of this building still stands).
- Bill spoke of the rail area of Upper Fern Tree Gully and the buses and transport which took people to the guest houses. He also spoke of Puffing Billy and the path it took.
- 1925 electric trains arrived. (1962 Upper Ferntree Gully—Belgrave
- Some of the real estate advertisements testified to both the development and the cost of various types of land in the area.
- Bill had many old photos of the Gully and identified the buildings.
- Brenock Park opened in 1945—a sports area. Fern Tree Gully Show, car racing,
- Angliss Hospital built 1939.

A very interesting presentation. Questions followed.

Chairman Paul thanked Bill and presented him with a small gift.

There being no further business Acting Pres. Graeme reminded members there would be no meeting next week due to the Australia Day holiday and that the following week would be committee/board meeting meetings. Announced the birthdays—Stuart Vize turns 80 on 22nd January(!).

Meeting closed at 8.45 p.m.
