

PROGRAM: MARIA GRONER—Travellers Aid Society

- TA nearly 100 years old (commenced 99 years ago). Founded to help mainly women and children who had come from overseas.
- Since 1972 the focus has changed. Southern Cross & Flinders Street Stations are the main offices.
- Meals & toilet assistance are also available at F & SC stations.
- Help older people to go from platform to platform.
- Also have a pilot service at Seymour.
- Have mobility scooters etc. available and people to help visitors from country regions get to medical appointments etc.
- Another program they have helps those who need to go somewhere but don't have the funds. Unfortunately there has just been a Government funding cut so this program has been curtailed.
- TA help children getting to education facilities (some from regional Victoria or across Vic).
- Luggage storage/showers/internet/breastfeeding/toilets etc. are also available.
- 50% State Govt /Local Govt funded. V-line and station management also help.
- 23 paid (part time) and 15 volunteers.

A number of questions were asked, particularly about knowledge of the services and the ability to fund the demand. Amazing list of activities.

There being no further business President Mike closed the meeting at 8.40

Malaria Awareness Day—April 30th

Around the world April 25th is declared as World Malaria Awareness Day. Here in Australia, because of Anzac Day, we have moved this day to April 30th. It's a time to reflect on the impact of malaria upon the world and the progress we are making in fighting and controlling it in our areas of focus ie Papua New Guinea, the Solomon Islands and Timor Leste

The war against malaria continues to be waged on many fronts. We should be very proud that Australia is at the forefront of world research seeking to find a suitable, cheap, long lasting and easy to administer vaccine.

Here's a summary of recent activities:

Papua New Guinea

An enormous five year program to cover PNG twice has been finalised. A total of just over 6 million Long Lasting Insecticide treated Nets (LLIN's) have been distributed. Their latest endeavour that is about to be put into practice is a program called "Chasing Malaria". It is a RAM program that will monitor every aid post in the country issuing free nets to positive cases of malaria. The movement history of the patient for the three weeks prior to these cases is recorded to facilitate the mapping of areas of malaria to allow remedial action to be taken. This includes cleaning up the village to remove any mosquito breeding sites.

The Solomon Islands

The very successful Healthy Village Program in the Solomon Islands is going extremely well and continues to grow. RAM provides the funding of \$1100 for each village (once it's made the application) to purchase the initial set of tools. These tools are used to remove stagnant water and to improve general drainage around the village. A recent report from the Solomon's stated that RAM forwarded over \$40,000 last December which allowed a further 38 villages to join the HV Program and that brings the total number to 120.

The Healthy Village Program is being trialled in PNG and RAM hopes to initiate the program in Timor Leste.

Timor Leste

In the last two years RAM, due to the generous support of Australian Rotary Clubs plus a Rotary Foundation Grant, has contributed significant funding to the Timorese National Malaria Control Program and this money has funded the Timorese Expectant Mothers' Program. To the end of October, 28,000 LLIN's of the 42,700 supplied, have been distributed to pregnant women in prenatal care. The National Malaria Control Program has, under the inspired leadership of Maria Mota initiated a vigorous antimalarial effort across the country that has resulted in very impressive results.

RAM is also funding a **Post Graduate Scholarship in Vector Borne Disease** and this has been made available through a partnership between RAM and the James Cook University's Australian Institute of Tropical Health and Medicine. The scholarship will enable one international student to undertake studies and research and is open to applications from Timor Leste, the Solomon Islands, PNG or Vanuatu.

The above update only outlines the most recent activities in our areas of focus. If you would like a fuller picture of the past and current RAM activities, I would be happy to speak at one of your Club Meetings.

Malaria Awareness Day gives your club an excellent opportunity to plan an activity that will raise awareness of what RAM is and what it has achieved to members of your community. It is also a great time to raise funds for this totally worthwhile cause. If you have a contribution please forward the cheque to me so that I can acknowledge them and my return letter will be a receipt for your funds. I will then send the cheque on the PP Richmond Manyweathers who is the National RAM Treasurer. Cheques are to be made payable to ROTARY AUSTRALIA OVERSEAS AID FUND (RAM).
