

Ken gave the club an update on the Nasavusava School for Special Education being the school where our club sponsors a number of students and showed pictures of structural improvements that need to be made at the school to improve their health and hygiene conditions.

Changes in government funding in 2014 towards children in special schools enabled our sponsorship fee for each child we sponsor being halved to \$125 per child, RC FTG now sponsors ten children with a further seven being sponsored by individual club members or other Rotarians outside of the club.

Children unable to go to school because of fees is more than 57 million.

Now planning to expand ABCD to Sth Africa and to a number

of Asian countries. With partnerships with the school community, Rotary clubs, Schools and University's and ADCCD Inc. Ongoing support has been through Deakin Univ, RMIT, Business (CSR) Philanthropic Trusts and RAWCS.



February 2015

Over the past couple of weeks I've attended a couple of Youth Exchange events and one of the cluster Youth Service Seminars. One can't help but be inspired by the impact these programs have on the young people involved. It's just wonderful to see how many of our clubs support these programs. When I present at these events, one of the key messages I leave with the young people is the obligations that we expect of them once they've been through the program: the obligation to be an advocate for Rotary; the obligation of citizenship, to work for their community; and the obligation to take what they've learned, to be the best they can possibly be in their chosen field. It's up to us to hold these young people to account - to encourage them to fulfil these obligations and to present them with further opportunities to be the best they can be.

Last week I had the privilege of presiding over the launch of a domestic violence program with Australian of the Year, Rosie Batty. I believe that as a community we're at a tipping point on domestic violence. Just like drink driving and smoking in public venues are no longer socially acceptable, so too is domestic violence now registering in society's consciousness. We need to support this - provide forums for events, support agencies that work at the front line, change men's behaviour. Rotary needs to be at the forefront of this important community issue.

It was wonderful to be at the Manningham cluster's Rotary Day event on Australia Day. Has your club participated in a Rotary Day event yet?
