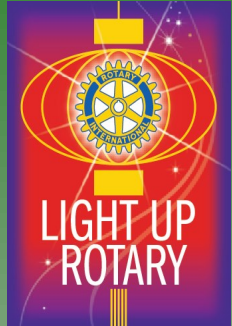

“MIKE’S MUSINGS....”

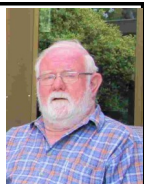
Hi, all!

PROGRAM: APPRENTICESHIP AWARD

Phil Walters introduced Matthew Muller of the AGA on behalf of the apprenticeship body, who thanked James' parents for coming from Pearcedale for the occasion.

James is an Electrical Apprentice.

AGA is a group training body looking after 1,000 local employees. Started in Gippsland and is now in Melbourne. Matthew gets satisfaction from assisting and training apprentices. He sees a big change in training returning to the schools.

Matthew is a field officer who mentors 90-odd electrical apprentices and emphasised the importance of support by trainers and employers in ensuring successful apprenticeships.

Questions:

- Group training organisations can find different employers for varying lengths of time. A benefit for both employer and apprentice. Continuity is also a busy area.
- Automotive area/engineers are generally long term commitments. Some others (plumbing) are much shorter.
- AGA also helps the apprentices to find a job on completion of their apprenticeship.
- Female apprenticeship—a female cable joiner has just won an "Apprentice of the Year" award. Women are mostly going for electrical.

Pres Mike presented the Award. James Penn thanked the club for the award and both Matt and his parents for their support.

Mike then thanked Phil for the effort he had put in in organising the Award, dealt with the housekeeping matters and closed the meeting at 8.55pm

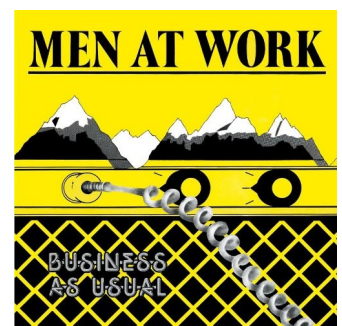


Newly formed - The Gully Men's Shed Inc
