

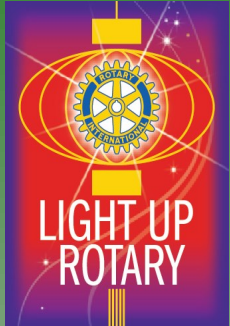

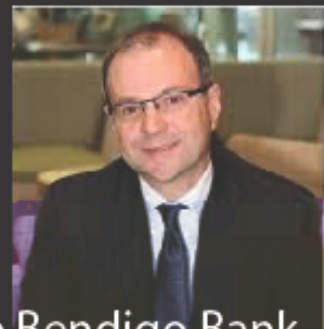

# Nasavusavu Special Ed – student update 23 February 2015.

Bula,

Just returned from visit with Maria Gilatabu, headmistress, who says she is retiring at the end of next week. I was introduced to Teang who will be taking her place.

Brief recaps on students 2014-2015. For those that have shifted to the Nasavusavu District School that is due to a teacher who was willing to take the students on. They are able to return to the Special School if they need to.

Alekosi - no longer sponsored - age 11 boy, had been a non-reader, attended for 2-3 years, he progressed in his reading and parents requested he attend the primary closer to them

Nemani - now sponsored at Nasavusavu District School next door, age 9 boy, attended for 3 years, had behavioral issues, now in class 1 new school and is coping well

Ruveni - now sponsored at Nasavusavu District School next door, age 14 boy, attended for 2 years due to being a weak reader, now in class 7

Grake - now sponsored at Nasavusavu District School next door, age 15 boy, attended for 5 years due to being a weak reader, now in class 7 and doing well, looking at 2 more years in school then on to vocational school, musical ability

Jonasa - age 11 boy, lives with elderly grandparents and attends school 3 days per week, poor communication skills, working on activities of daily living (ie toileting skills), long term student

Maria - age 11 girl, has Down's Syndrome, has attended for 3 years, communication difficulties, may move to Nasavusavu District School in 2016

Nayana - age 10 girl, has attended for 2 years, did not start school at normal age, also goes to kindergarden in her village, now in year 3, physically challenged, sometime after birth became unable to use her legs, she now uses a wheelchair and a walker as well as walking around holding the walkway rails, speaks well, helpful in sweeping and mopping

Jovani - age 11 boy, in year 3, came for 1 year then off 1 year returning in 2014, behavioral issues, slow mentally, need help with reading, may move the Nasavusavu District School next door in the future

Semiti - age 10 boy, referred from his former primary school as a non-reader, had eye problems and Rotary helped with expenses so he could visit a clinic several hours away, now has glasses, will return to primary school next year

Alisi - age 12 girl, has attended for 5 years, rheumatic heart disease, parents kept her at home so started school a bit late, parents prefer she remain at the Special School and re-inforce with her that she is fragile and weak, they are working to help her realise that she can do more, she may be moved to a primary school in the future

Losana - age 14 girl, started schooling at age 10-11, referred in 2014 from former primary school, communication issues, is now coping well and is the head girl prefect

Salote - age 12 girl, has attended for 8 years, has multiple disabilities - communication, mental

Asline - age 18 girl, has attended for 10 years, small for her age, her mood changes affect her abilities, can read, has some memory and mental issues, mother has requested cooking skills be reinforced
