

PROGRAM: Child Slavery in Nepal—Robyn & Tony Stokes

Tony:

- Rotarian Action Group Against Child Slavery.
- Has RI recognition and is relatively new.
- Despite being illegal, nearly 35 million people are in slavery (1.2m children) around the world.
- Is the third biggest crime in the world. E.g. Diamonds, brides and drugs.
- There are many forms of slavery: Trafficking, bonded labour, sexual exploitation, child marriage, child soldiers, cost based crimes.

Robyn:

- Showed a map of Nepal highlighting high risk human trafficking areas.
- Nepal has 29m people—estimate 20K girls are trafficked out of Nepal per annum. The borders between India and China are very
- In 1993 the Maiti district was founded. It is a trafficking-free area.
- Robyn then told the story of a girl who was married at 8 years of age; she ended up in Maiti.
- Maiti house and educate the girls so they can find a better life.

Tony:

With the advent of the recent quake the Maiti buildings are largely intact but the girls are sleeping outside because of the dangers of after-quakes. In addition, Maiti have taken an additional 200 children who have been left homeless and/or orphaned by the disaster.

Aims of visit:

- Awareness (of slavery) (at Maiti);
- Action (sponsorship)
- Supply chain awareness
- Raise awareness throughout Rotary
- District are showing interest.

Questions were asked and answered.

Rob thanked Robyn and Tony for coming and presented the usual speakers gift.

There being no further business President Mike reminded everyone that there would be no club meeting next Monday as we were attending the Cluster Meeting on Tuesday.


