

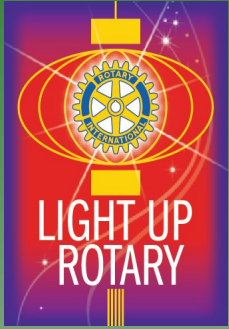

Hi, all!

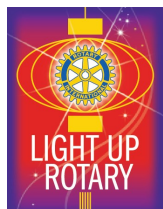
This is my last Musings – doesn't time fly when you are having fun and/or busy?

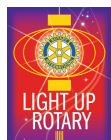

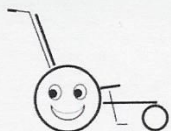

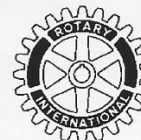

Dear Sir/Madam,

Since our last newsletter, your donations have enabled us to reach a great milestone.

30,000th free wheelchair



The Governor of Western Australia, Her Excellency Kerry Sanderson (in red) attended a ceremony along with a number of politicians, volunteers, generous suppliers and friends, to send off our 30,000th wheelchair.

This wheelchair along with 165 others, was sent off next day to be distributed to the poor and disabled children in Myanmar. As we do not use your donations for expenses including freight, this consignment was arranged by the Rotary Club of Wanneroo. The ceremony was marked by giving thanks for the continuing generous support of the State Government, The Christian Brothers, The Rotary Club of Scarborough and clubs across Australia, schools, commercial enterprises, social groups, generous suppliers

and of course you - without you, our project would not exist.

By request from Occupational Therapists in the field, we have added a further refinement to a proportion of our wheelchairs. An abductor wedge, fitted in front of the seat to help position the legs of the many recipients with cerebral palsy. Our fully fitted wheelchair now has ten sewn covers for the support devices all sewn by 50 keen ladies working at home. They produce over 2,500 covers per month.

A novel fund raiser – eight employees of the Australia-Africa Mining Industry Group, all over 50, have just embarked on a 2 month Wheelchairs for Kids Fund raising cycle ride 7,000 KMs across the USA, all at their own expense. We don't pay fund raisers and rely on our friends and donors spreading the word. This is working very well. Your help would be appreciated by talking to others about us, or by passing on the enclosed pamphlet.
