Advised she had attended the Ferntree Gully CFA Awards Night and had been approached by Peter Smith (Captain of Upper Ferntree Gully CFA) who mentioned that they still want Rotary to be involved with the annual intersection collection but also would like our assistance in organising their 90th birthday celebrations in 2016. More details to be given later.

Asked that Great Community Raffle tickets (stubs and unsold tickets) be returned by next week.

Youth Service: Paul Wilson

Fairhills Secondary College—excited about RYPEN offering.

Fellowship: Fran Mandergeddes

- Red Faces—a great night. Seeks to resurrect FTG Follies. Promised to take the names of those interested.
- Fran's daughter's childcare centre may be closed by Knox Council. Not yet definite—Federal grant will be removed in 2017. On 8th September the Council meeting will decide. Local residents need to make their feelings known.

Sergeant-at-Arms: Mike Spark

Sgt. Mike took our dollars using the Stellar Awards as the basis for extraction. He also used universal truths.

Skill: Virginia drew 6 of hearts. Great! We live still.

PROGRAM: D. G. David Tolstrup—The Year Ahead

Commenced with the question "Why am I here?"

- To find out how the club is doing
- To support the club in its aims

Rotary International—emphasis:

- Education
- Water Sanitation
- Polio Plus—the current RI President K R (Ravi) Ravindran has a particular interest in eradicating polio so additional efforts to finally eradicate it are needed this year.
- Rotary Foundation—has changed:

- We now need to have a greater partnership with locals and must have at least a five year life (sustainability).
- A percentage of the annual giving comes back to the District and is available for local grants
- Approx. 50% of local contributions to Rotary Foundation in the past 12 months came from individuals.
- Bequests: \$10,000 or less!
- Rotary Health—Mental Health is a focus. RI is funding indigenous studies in health.

District initiatives this year:

- Domestic violence—funding available
- Mens Health (prostate cancer)
- Young driver safety

DG's favourite program for 2015-16: INTERPLAST. He seeks to raise funds to send a team overseas this year (\$45,000).

Alison:

Project is ***Food Security for Indigenous Children in the Kimberley area***. She spoke of the need – Feed the Little Children; a Broome charity which feeds and teaches nutrition for young children. They also teach the children to cook, shop etc.

An Aboriginal school near the Bungle Bungles. A private school which gets great attendance levels and teacher retention. They feed kids breakfast and lunch. A Stephanie Alexander garden has been set up. The project is to fund a part-time gardener.

DG David: Our Club-

- Register under *My Rotary*
- Attend District Seminars (Membership/Foundation and others)
- Rotary Institute Leadership, another program
- Visibility of our club is very good. We support community groups, e.g. Mens Shed. We support cluster group; RYLA, RYPEN and other youth programs. We support International projects.
- Enid H's support to the District is great
- Rotary Foundation—\$39,000 contributed over the years
- No Rotary Benefactors—should support this.
- The future—is positive particularly in Asia.
- Commended our target of achieving six new members in 2015-16.
- Sustainability:
 - No President Elect—need one quickly.
 - Establish (maybe through the cluster) a Rotaract and an Interact Club. (Parents of Interactors—good potential Rotary members.
- Theme for this year ***Be A Gift to the World***. Someone thought enough of each of us to invite them to join Rotary. ENJOY it!

President Paul thanked David & Alison and expressed the hope that our club could deliver. In Alison's area he reminded us that our own backyard was in need of help as much as other countries. He presented Alison with a cheque, being the club's contribution to her project. Dealt with the housekeeping and closed the meeting at 8.40 p.m.
