-Low-Level Scholarship Grants – is my focus on Foundation Grants tonight

The Low-Level Scholarship program is entirely directed to financially disadvantaged students, who are to be nominated by their school principals.

The purpose of the scholarships is to ensure that such students are encouraged to complete their secondary education, and as the scholarships will be awarded in each of this and the next school year, they are therefore available to students entering Year 11 in 2016 and Year 12 in 2017.

The scholarships are made up of \$1000 contributed by your club and matched with a \$1,000 Low-Level Scholarship Grant of \$1,000. This will occur in both this and next Rotary years, so that at the beginning of 2016 and 2017 there will be \$2,000 to be awarded. The expectation is that the scholarship will be for one student, but if the school principal requests that two students be supported with half the scholarship money each, in each year, then that is acceptable to us.

But we must recognise that the school, the student(s) or the parents may wish the scholarships to be provided anonymously


GUEST SPEAKER – REG HARRIS LOYALTY PROGRAM
