One of its biggest initiatives aims at eradicating polio through its PolioPlus program, launched in 1985. Since then, Rotary and its partners, including the World Health Organization and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, have immunized more than 2.5 billion children, reducing the incidence of polio by 99 percent and eradicating it from all but three countries.



Interplast

Fantastic News for District 9810- An Interplast Surgical and Training Program- to Laos

Thanks to those Clubs and persons in D9810 who donated to Interplast in 2014/15- nearly **\$39,000**.

Our District is using those funds, combined with funds from an Australian private donor (with business interests in Laos who is keen to assist) to contribute to the cost of a **two week surgical program in Vientiane, Laos** which will occur in **February 2016**.

It will consist of a team of 7 volunteers - 2 surgeons, 2 anaesthetists and 3 nurses to deliver this two week program of **free** plastic and reconstructive surgery and training.

Our involvement in this program was requested by Interplast recently. Our District 9810 Interplast Committee, at its meeting on the **19th November** last, wholeheartedly agreed.

Interplast has been working in Laos since 1996, where it initially focused on surgical programs and the **training** of local surgeons in cleft surgery. However, with the establishment of a cleft team of local surgeons, Interplast programs- **surgical and training now focus on burns surgery** based at the **Mahosot Hospital in Vientiane**. Further details and a **Report** will be given later on.

Since 1996, Interplast has delivered **29 program activities** (surgical and separate training programs) to Laos. This February 2015 program will be the 31st activity. Across these programs, Interplast teams have undertaken **1355 life** changing operations and consulted **2291** patients.

D9810 funds totalling \$39,000 will combine with \$35,000 from the said private donor, to cover the estimated total of \$74,000 in costs. Laos is a high cost program.

The Costs we are paying for are: Airfares \$9500; Accommodation \$10,500; Surgical equipment and supplies \$14,000, Freight of equipment \$5000- totalling **\$39,000**. **The costs** being paid by the **second donor** are: insurance, visas, medical registrations, translators, volunteer meals, local hospital costs for in patient operative care and local drugs, program coordination and incidental costs, totalling **\$35,000**.

The 26 Contributing Clubs in 2014/15 are set out on page 39 of the **2014/15 Annual Report**. They are, in alphabetical order: Bayswater, Bentleigh Moorabbin Central, Box Hill, Box Hill Central, Chelsea, Cheltenham, Clayton, Dingley Village, Emerald & District, Forest Hill, Glen Waverley, Hampton, Healesville, Lilydale, Manningham, Mitcham, Mont Albert and Surrey Hills, Moorleigh Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Noble Park, Nunawading, Oakleigh, Ringwood, Templestowe, Wandin and Warandyte -Donvale. **Thanks Again!**

A Plea

Please support District Governor David's objective to raise **\$45,000** this year to fund a Surgical Team. **If we reach the target early** it is possible that a surgical program will be allocated **by June 2016**.

In 2014/15, six Clubs accounted for \$23,000 in both Club and individual donations. We cannot take this level of wonderful support for granted and ask for support from all Clubs !

If those 26 Clubs that supported Interplast last year continue to support Interplast this year, and hopefully to the same, or an increased the level of support, **that would be fantastic**.
