Rotary FTG funds scholarships for two students at MDLC

As part of our youth support program, RC FTG is offering two scholarships per year to provide support for 'financially disadvantaged secondary students to complete their Year 11 and year 12 schooling' in 2016 and 2017 at Mountain District Learning Centre.

Each scholarship is to be for \$2,000, to be used for the same student over two years (that is: \$1,000 for 2016 and the same for 2017). Since these scholarships are awarded on the basis of financial disadvantage rather than academic merit, the names of the students will not be disclosed.

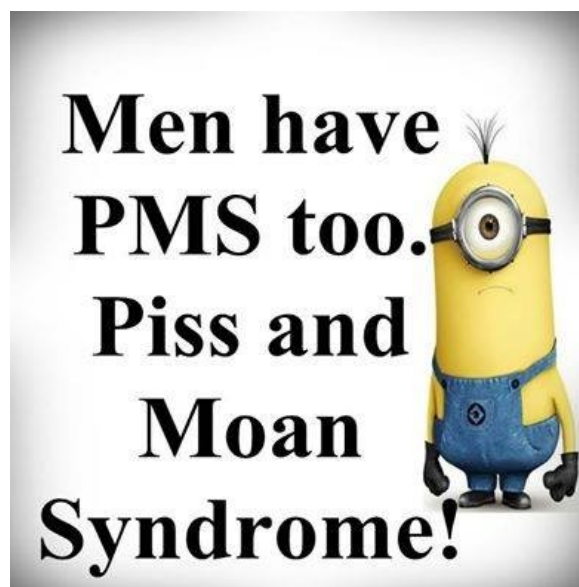

A "Fiddle Blanket" is a lap sized sensory blanket that provides both warmth and a distraction, and are designed to allow "doing", and "touching". The blankets are usually made from wool or fabric, and have things like buttons, bows, laces, zips and other sensory items sewn onto the blanket. "Activity Muffs" are based on the same idea as the fiddle blanket, but are sewn in the shape of a hand muff to keep hands warm.
