Next Week's Speaker—Nicky Culhane—SPANEAST

SPANeast is a passionate committee of people whose personal experiences have motivated them to increase the community awareness of suicide in a way that is uplifting, inclusive and resourceful.

SPANeast is an independent extension of S.P.A.N.(Geelong) which aims to continue their work throughout the Eastern Suburbs.

SPANeast held it's Inaugural Community Walk on Australia Day 2013 to coincide with S.P.A.N. (Geelong).

In March 2014, there was also a very successful SPAN community walk in Bendigo.

SPANeast now holds it's annual Community Awareness Walk on the last Sunday in October each year.

Our aim is to challenge the taboo and stigma associated with suicide; to provide information about and access to help for those contemplating or bereaved by suicide; as well as presenting a united and non-threatening voice to open the channels of discussion around suicide. Anyone who has thought about committing suicide or is grieving someone lost to suicide knows how isolating it can be. We aim to assist in keeping these people connected to society and therefore connected to their own lives.

INTERPLAST—UPDATE

10th February 2016

Here's a brief update from the Interplast team who are in Laos now...

The team have all arrived safely in Vientiane. They are working at the Mahosot General Hospital from Monday 8 through to Friday 19 February.

On Monday 8 February the team was warmly welcomed at the hospital by the Director of the Hospital, Dr Bounthaphany, the Australian Ambassador to Laos, Mr John Williams, the Women's International Group and hospital staff. Lao media and TV crew were also there to capture the occasion (see article in Lao News Agency: <http://kpl.gov.la/en/detail.aspx?id=10331>) N.B: Interplast team will operate in February 2016 at Mahosot Hospital - not in December 2016 as per the last line in the Laos news article.

Interplast Volunteer Surgeon & Lao Country Coordinator, Philip Slattery and Interplast Volunteer Anaesthetist, Chris Lowry have also had a meeting with hospital management to discuss the future planning for plastic and reconstructive surgery at Mahosot General Hospital. This meeting was very fruitful and a young plastic surgeon has been identified that Interplast will work closely with to keep building up the capacity of the hospital.

The team have reported that the consultation clinic on Monday 8 February "went really well...and they have some great cases to do". These operations will be performed from Tuesday 9 thru to Thursday 18 February).

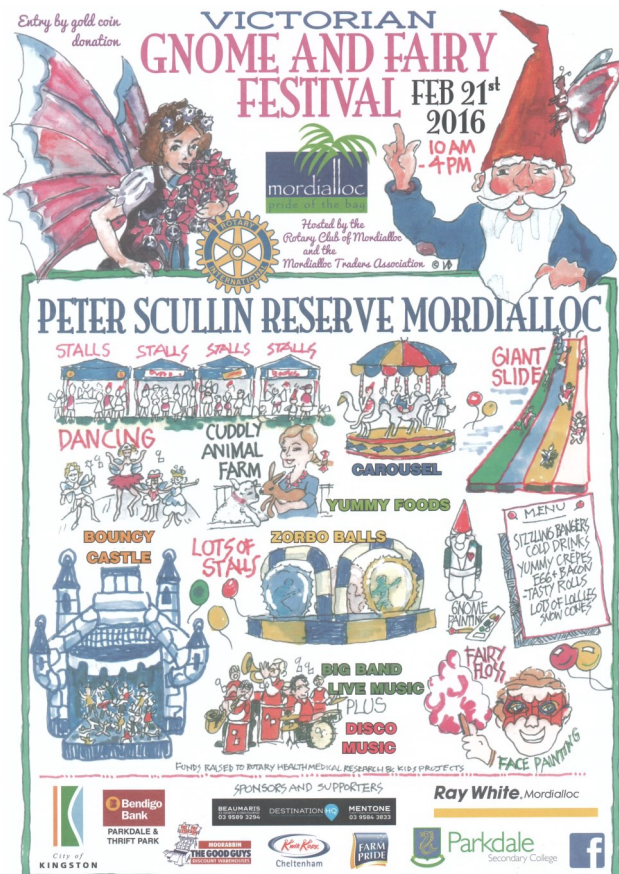
That's about as much as we can report at the moment....they keep in contact with the office by email but a proper report will be forwarded after they return.
