## **PROGRAM: KATE KENT-EVANS—KIOSC**

Kate explained what the initials KIOSC stood for and indicated that its role was to prepare children for the jobs they would need to be involved in, in the future, e.g. science and technology.

Many students were leaving without qualifications and poor prospects for their future. Need to get schools/Council and industry working together.

**Innovation**—New technology such as virtual reality, 3-D printing. Try to get kids to think creatively and use things that exist in the local area.

**Opportunity**—Giving chances for things such as mentoring or exposing the kids to work situations and speakers who can acquaint them with what is going on and is available.

**Sustainability**—Getting them to think about what is developing and are we wasting materials?

6 core schools in Knox but others outside have done programs. Twice per year at least for the Knox school kids. Try to work in teams and interact. She gave examples of topics, e.g. water.

At year 10 start talking of careers and give more advanced practical work. They have a variety of topics/activities at this stage. Years 11/12 VET course kids and science subject kids, they take out into industry the kids more around the room *doing things*. Robotics/forensics etc. that engage kids..

VET in house subjects are those that require expensive equipment and which generally are not available elsewhere. 2 year course which goes towards degree. Because of their practical experience they are often preferred to degree holders. They do business tours, e.g. Caribbean Business Park.

Offered to arrange for RC FTG members to attend a KIOSC / Fairhills High School Curriculum day.

A really interesting presentation and an initiative in our area.


Pres Paul did the housekeeping but said that he would arrange a visit when Fairhills HS are there.
