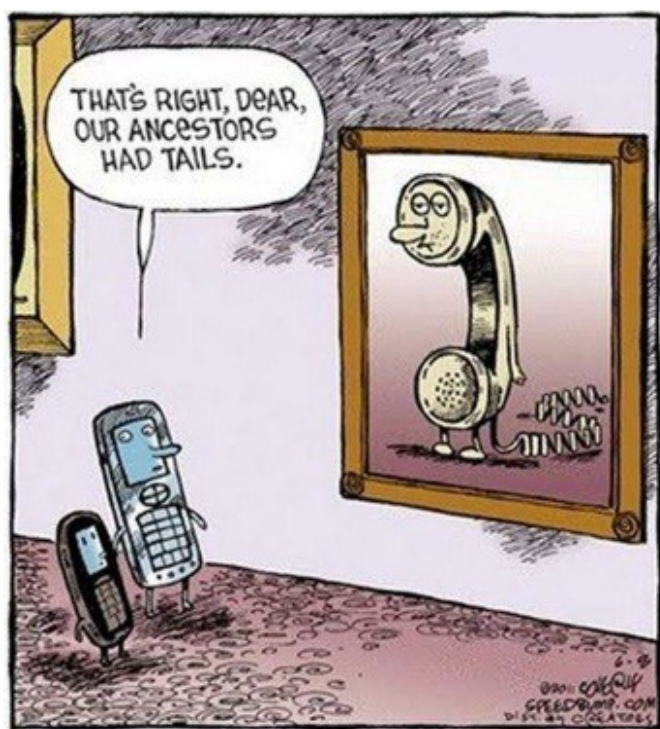
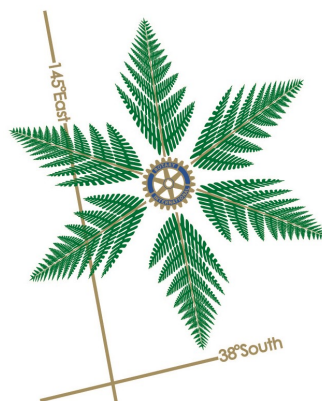

### Dear Club Presidents

A few weeks ago I contacted you regarding the chartering of a club of Timorese Nationals in Dili. You will recall that the club will comprise existing Rotaractors who need to retire from Rotaract due to their age. A plea has been made to the Australian Rotary Community to support these folk in getting this club off the ground. It is essential that our support be sustainable – three to five years is the time frame being discussed.

The attached email trail explains the necessity and the basis of the project.

I would encourage clubs, or a cluster, to consider “adopting” a member of this new club. It has been suggested that \$500 a year committed for up to five years be the unit of support. I understand that \$500 may be too much for most individual clubs, but if all clubs in a cluster were to join together the target may be more achievable. If our District was able to support ten members [or even five] that would be fantastic.

You will note that the need is imminent and that banking details are contained in the details below.

Please advise me if you think that your club may be able to assist.

Thank you for considering this project.
