UPDATE ON OUR SPECIAL ED. STUDENT—ROPATE

Liz and I had a very productive meeting with Nowdla at Namale yesterday. Nowdla is the extremely capable wife of the manager Bill Keefe and she helps manage the Namale medical fund. Namale are our top resort in terms of price and luxury; it's owned by Tony Robbins, the motivational guru from the US. They have a generous medical fund which they use to help their staff and the staff families to meet medical expenses, flying them to Suva and even New Zealand to receive treatment when needed.

Initially they indicated that they would cover any gap in funding, but Nowdla has now told us that they are committed to the full \$6,000 (in fact, \$6,500 as there are some additional local travel expenses). She pointed out that as the Namale funds ONLY go to staff and their families, it would be sensible to keep our funds (by which I mean our own club funds and any other funds we could raise from donors such as yourselves) for other people who could not call on Namale funds. I do of course realize that your own contribution was specifically for Ropate as he is an ABCD sponsored student, and that it does not constitute a back-up fund for just anyone.

Your fast action and generous contribution is much appreciated; I leave it to you to decide what to do, but as extra funds are always needed somewhere, it's likely that you have another pressing request elsewhere. (And if not, there will always be something we can do for the students and their schools!)

So I echo Barbara's thanks; it's such a pleasure to know that we have the support of clubs like yours when we put out a call for help.
