PROGRAM: Harvey Lane—INTERPLAST

Harvey opened by thanking the club for their \$1000.00 donation to Interplast following his last visit.

Harvey showed a prepared video showing the commitment between Rotary and the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons as a not for profit organisation. The partnership began in 1983. Interplast provides health care to over 17 countries in our region, being countries with inadequate medical services. Medical teams donate their time, free of charge, to

provide surgical procedures to mainly young people who could not afford such treatment. Ninety One procedures are planned for the coming year provided the funding is raised.

Rotary funding directly determines the number of surgical and training programs are conducted. Within Dist. 9810 twenty two clubs have not supported Interplast in the past Rotary year although \$45,000 has been raised. Wandin R.C are raising funds to support their own surgical team.

Harvey encouraged the club to support Interplast with more funding in the next Rotary year.

President Christine closed the meeting at 8.30pm
