

Thanks to the accepting locals, a great time was had by all, with some great memories. "A reflective place, not a sad place" was her summation. Her husband Vince, a local musician and songwriter, showed us a guitar with a neck made from a tree grown from a Lone Pine seedling – a beautiful piece of artistry. He then sang a

song "On the 25th day a hundred Aprils ago" which was generated by Margie's thoughts on the ANZAC tour and the reasons for its existence – the horror of war. It was a brilliant performance which got a standing ovation from those present!

President Christine thanked the speakers and the partners, and closed the meeting at 8.38pm

NEW MEAL ARRANGEMENTS WITH FERNTREE GULLY BOWLING CLUB

Week 4	Beer Battered Fish / Chicken Schnitzel


In the event of a week 5 (a couple of times per year) we would have Grilled fish / Lamb Shank
