Youth Protection Policy

As advised at the District Training Assembly on 22nd May 2016, an updated Youth Protection policy was made available on the District Website, and all Presidents were requested to familiarise themselves with the new policy, and ensure their club members were informed of and understood the contents.

At the Club President's meeting held on the 19th August 2016, Presidents were informed that it had been necessary to further amend the District Youth Protection policy, after being informed of new State Government regulations, coming into effect as at the 1st January 2017.

Finally, at the District Youth Service Seminar, held on the 16th September, a brief update was provided, informing the attendees that a training session was being organised, to update all clubs of the key changes expected to come into force on the 1st January, 2017.

In an endeavour to ensure the newly amended District Youth Protection policy is fully understood by as many Rotarians as possible, and certainly those involved in Youth Programs, a training session has been organised as follows:

Date: Saturday morning, 22nd October 2016.

Time: 9.00am for 9.15am commencement – Finish 11.15am

Venue: Mount Waverley Youth Centre, 45 Miller Crescent, Mount Waverley.

Due to the extensive changes being made to our District Youth Protection policy, in order to conform with the new legislation, it is extremely important that every club is represented at this training session.

The invitation is addressed to all Club Presidents, all Club Youth Service Chairs and all Club Protection Officers and we request that if all 3 incumbents are not able to attend, that clubs endeavour to ensure that 2 out of the 3 invitees attend the training.
