District Governor's Report

Doesn't time fly when you're having fun? Frank's and my fun this year continues to be visiting clubs and being absolutely blown away by the range of projects being undertaken, as well as the time given to them.

There is absolutely no doubt in my mind that we are privileged to be part of an organisation which has service so deeply entrenched in the work that it does, locally and internationally.

One of the many highlights for me last month was to hear that District 9810 had been awarded the 2015-2016 Australian Rotary Health Dick White District Achievement Award for the Million Dollar Bike Ride to Conference.

The Ride for Research Dollars, also known as the Ride to Conference, has been an exceptionally successful district activity for many years, with a huge variety of participants – Rotarians, partners, friends, exchange students and all the associated support teams. This is one of those occasions when we can really say, it has been an absolutely AWESOME effort on the part of all those involved.

The award will be presented to PDG David Tolstrup at the Presidents Meeting in November. At the Boronia club visit, there was the opportunity to recognise the amazing work done by the organising committee and Rob Henry (RC Boronia). It's important also to acknowledge the support Rob gets from his club and its members too.

Congratulations all round – many have joined in over the years and created a very successful project for many people with an exceptional benefit to Australian Rotary Health and the people the organisation supports and assists.

Much of the success we see is based on partnerships, within the clubs, between clubs and with external organisations which enable a greater profile and visibility for projects. Those external partnerships also contribute more funding than might otherwise be available which is definitely a benefit for the beneficiaries of those projects as well the clubs involved. I encourage you to consider new external partnerships whenever that is possible.

In the past months we have mourned the loss of Rotarians who have given great service to the district in many ways over many years – you will read more about PDG Fred Hay and PP Jason Chetty later in the newsletter.

All clubs would be aware of the increased attention on insurance declarations and the updated D9810 Youth Protection Policy, required as part of legislative changes. PDG Tony Monley has completed this herculean task, with input from PDG Merv Ericson (District Club Protection Coordinator) and Roger Smith (District Insurance Officer). I appreciate everything they have done to ensure the district is complying with all the complexities of this legislation.

D9810 has a Youth Protection Policy that has recently been amended to comply with the requirements of the Victorian Government standards. All Rotary clubs in D9810, by virtue of their being members of the incorporated association of D9810, are bound to comply with the policies of D9810, without exception.

Provisions of the policy apply to all Rotary programs and projects and all associated volunteers, whether Rotary members or not.

All clubs (ideally Presidents and Youth Service or Club Protection Officer) and Youth Service District Committee Chairs are required to participate in the district organised training which is part of implementing the policy. The first training session was held on 22nd October, a second training session will be provided soon. This will then be integrated in the annual round of Learning and Development for Presidents Elect and Club Officers. We'll keep you up to date.

I continue to encourage all Rotarians to participate in the various learning opportunities provided by the district in order that they can learn more about local and international possibilities. I also believe that increased knowledge helps to increase enthusiasm and that can only benefit us all, especially when we share it with others beyond Rotary. The dates are on P.23 of the District Directory with further details in Highlights.

Thank you very much for all you are doing in continuing our great tradition of 'Rotary Serving Humanity' – keep up your wonderful work!

Iconic Australian Musician

Mike Brady AM (born Michael Brady; 28 February 1948) is an Australian musician most commonly associated with the Australian Rules football anthems "Up There Cazaly", referring to 1920s and 1930s St Kilda player Roy Cazaly and "One Day in September" about Grand Final day in Melbourne. "Up There Cazaly" topped the Australian singles charts in September 1979 and briefly held the record as best-selling Australian single.

Born in England he migrated to Australia in the 1950s with his family. He started performing when he was 15 and he was one-third of the 1960s pop act MPD Ltd. (which stood for Mike, Pete and Danny) which had several hits in Australia. He toured Australia, the U.K. and Vietnam

Brady had established recording studios in Melbourne, Australia where the international hit song "Shaddap Your Face" was recorded by Joe Dolce.

Since then Brady has continued to work in advertising, writing jingles such as "Dodo, Dodo, internet that flies" and "Lucky you're with AAMI".

He has written songs for popular Australian artists such as John Farnham and Tina Arena and produced albums by Arena and Colleen Hewett. He also wrote the song "Courage in their Eyes" for the Seven Network's Olympics coverage.

In addition to his jingle writing and performing, Brady also works at Melbourne radio station, 3AW.

Brady is also the chairman of Elite Minds, a company that uses online cognitive neuroscience people analytics tools in the sectors of Corporate, Driving, Sport, Education, Aviation and Healthcare.

In the 2013 Queens Birthday Honours List, Mike Brady was made a member of the Order of Australia (AM) "For significant service to the community, and to music as a composer and performer". He is a board member on the Prostate Cancer Foundation Australia Victorian Board and has performed at many Men's health events. He has been a board director of Variety Victoria and is a Life Member of the organisation. He is also a patron of the Bali Children Foundation and the Australian Huntington's Disease Association (Vic), and is involved with the Bluearth Foundation, Melbourne Legacy and the Yooralla Society. He is also an Australia Day ambassador. Brady lives in Melbourne, Australia. He has four children
