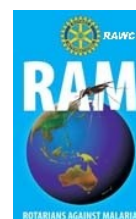

Announcements:

☑ Paul welcomed everyone, including the guest speaker Gloria Hargreaves of RAM (speaking about Malaria) and Fran (happy to be back from illness with pneumonia/asthma).

Paul McAloney had distributed the incoming mail.

Confirmed that Paul, Mike, Enid and Ray will attend the District Youth Forum in Rowville on February 28, as will Adrienne and Emma from Fairhills High School.

Rotary Knowledge – nil this week

Membership – John Flemming had talked about Rotary to oldies at Willowbank Aged Care – he didn't take the whole hour allocated, luckily!

Foundation – Mike advised that he had started to collect the Centurion monies, and had cash from himself and Rob Hurst to start the collection effort.

Sergeant-at-arms. Ray extracted loot from all members with ease, using horrible but true statements from young kids on a range of life topics.
13 of Clubs was drawn, so we live again!

Guest Speaker – Gloria Hargreaves

Gloria is from Emerald Rotary, and is in her 3rd year as president of R.A.M. (Rotarians against Malaria). She updated us on the ever-changing projects.

25 April is **Malaria Awareness Day**, but because of Anzac Day, fundraising dinner activities will be on the following weekend at Waverley Country Club.
Flyers were distributed.

RAM's mission is "a volunteer-run organisation working to eliminate Malaria"

Malaria affects 40 % of the population (but that's down by 37% in the last 15 years!) 240 million have it world-wide, and 438,000 are affected each year (of which 75% are kids under five).

Australian researchers from Burnet, W&E Hall, and Griffith Uni have developed a new vaccine **Mosquirox** to halt the spread. Kids in Africa are being jabbed at 1, 2, 20 and 35 months of age.

PNG has been given 9 million mozzie nets since 2005 (500,000 from RAM), dropping the death toll by 70% in some provinces – but there's a long way to go.

Solomon Islands (922 islands!) are being given garden tools (\$1700 per village) to cut the breeding sites of mozzies, and have reduced 75% of the afflicted.

Timor Leste is concentrating on nets for pregnant mums (\$425,000 to 89% of the mums, tracked by census data)

Many questions were answered about the different forms of disease (Ross River, Dengue Fever, etc), and Mike suggested that RAM align with the RSL, with their aging membership that has already been exposed to Malaria, for funding and increased awareness of the debilitating and often fatal disease.

A very interesting session.

Acting President Paul read out next week's housekeeping duties and closed the meeting at 8.25 pm.
