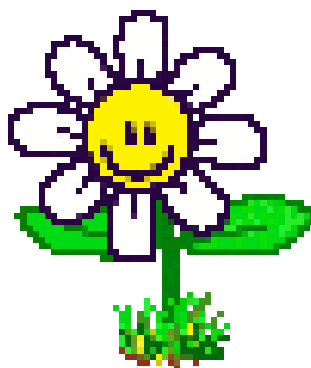


“THE HERE AND HAPPY”

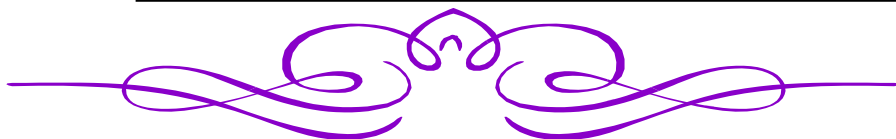

The passion and purpose is essential to successful projects and ultimately clubs.

ROTARY ACRONYMS

There are so many acronyms in the Rotary language, that it is so hard to remember them all, so we shall explain a few each Newsletter to build knowledge. Feel free to put these into your Club Newsletter or Bulletin:

RYLA: Rotary Youth Leadership Seminar—a leadership program for 18 to 30 year olds held in July annually in District 9810. This is a formal program of Rotary International.

NYSF: National Youth Science Forum—a Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) and leadership program for students entering Year 12. The program is highly competitive. A District committee interviews and selects candidates.

AG: Assistant Governor This is a person appointed by the District Governor (or DG) to work with the clubs assigned. Note this is AG, not ADG as sometimes referred to.

DTA: District Training Assembly This was formerly called District Assembly and is a forum held annually to launch the new Theme to members of clubs who come together to be trained in their respective areas of responsibility for the following Rotary year. This will be held at Deakin University in Burwood on 21 May, 2017.

PETS: Presidents Elect Training Assembly This is the training seminar for Presidents for the upcoming year. This is a Multi District Seminar held in Ballarat this year.
