John Flemming advised that again this year we are organising the sale of Bowel Cancer screening kits at 4 local chemists. We were only advised of this at short notice but John managed to organise everything satisfactorily.

Sergeant Graeme Aspinall managed to lighten our pockets with some little known facts about Victoria. Skill was unsuccessfully attempted by John F who drew the 6 of hearts.

## Program: Moradabad Project (India)

Our guest speaker this week was John Barnes from The Rotary Club of Clayton. John and his team do a lot of projects in Moradabad in India. The projects they undertake all involve people living in the slums; these projects include building toilets, supplying facilities for clean drinking water and also, in conjunction with Moradabad Hospital, sponsoring a mobile medical van, staffed by various specialists which visits the slums to provide medical services for up to 60,000 people living in these conditions.

Another one of the services provided here is the continuing the fight against Polio. This is done by organising rallies on the Saturday to notify everyone that this will be happening and

then on Sunday they spend the day doing Vaccination's. They get a lot of support from the Government, Religious organisation and of course the local Rotary Club's who are very well organised. John mentioned that to date this year only 5 new cases of Polio have been reported.

RC Fern Tree Gully have committed \$1,000 towards the medical van. John made a point of thanking us for this and confirmed that this project will now be fully funded once the District/Global grants are confirmed.

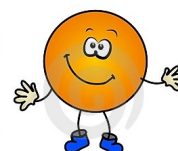
President Christine thanked John for his very informative and interesting presentation and closed the meeting at 8.35pm.

### COMMUNITY MINUTES

We also spoke about a couple of fundraising programs. As Graeme bought up a couple of months ago, the possibility of having an antique and collectables fair. Graeme did mention that we need to decide as a club what project we are raising the funds for as this helps with selling the idea to participants. I also put forward the possibility of having a Dutch auction provided we can get enough businesses to sponsor us with a donation of something to auction.

#### MONTHLY REPORT

April 2017

There is not a lot to add to International Service since the March report.

- Rotary Club of Clayton's project – Moradabad Mobile Health Camps – India (\$1,000)

- Nasavusavu Special Education School.  
Barbara L'Amie (Fiji) and the ABC Dreams management have been contacted re the additional five students to be sponsored. A reply has been received from Barbara L'Amie telling us that they are thrilled to know we are intending to expand our sponsorship. Part of her reply is quoted hereunder:

*As all payments for your students uniforms and supplies were paid out in January and February from funds received in 2016 any funds received in 2017 for student sponsorship will be earmarked for 2018 school year.*

*On choosing students, our committee has previously made the decision that new students will be chosen during October/November of the final term. That is based on past experience of students being chosen, profile and artwork completed then forwarded and to have the student not complete the year requiring that we choose another student, complete profile and artwork. We hope your membership understand our position and trust that we will certainly liaise with the head teacher to find new students for you.*

I will be liaising further with Barbara before we submit our annual sponsorship funds in October/November this year.

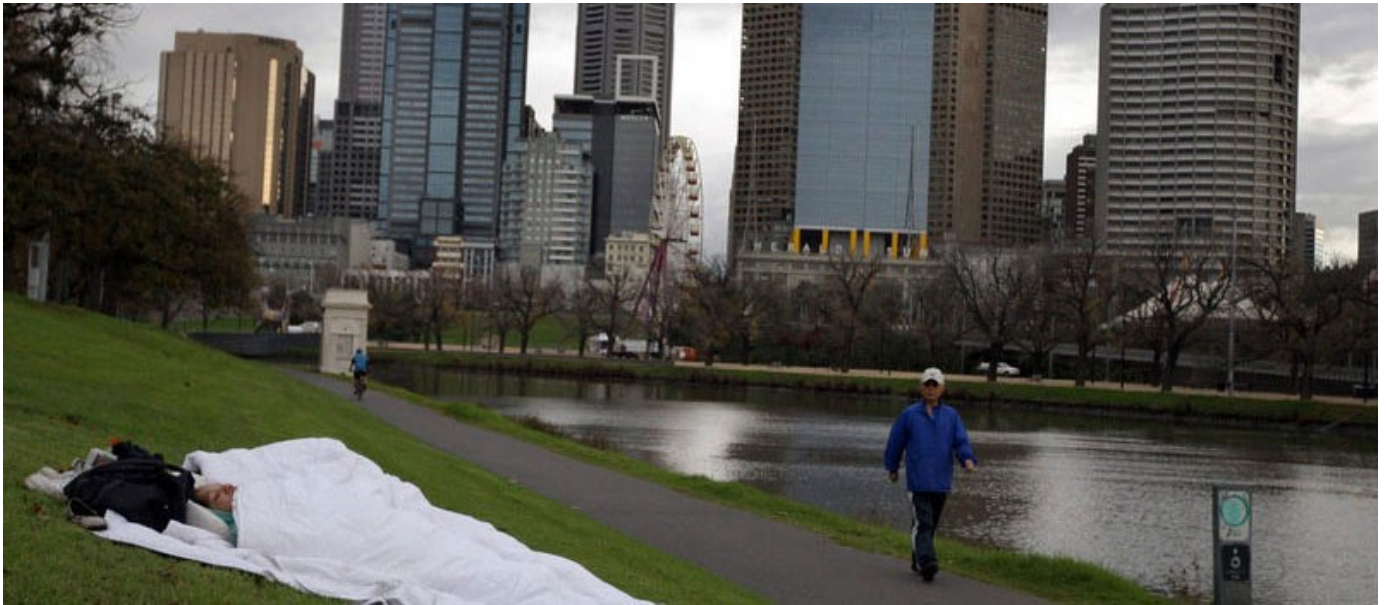
#### New Projects:

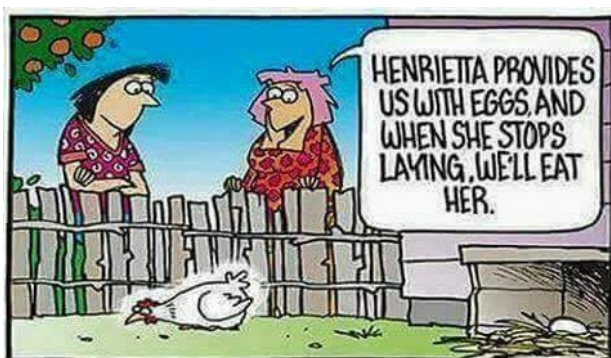
