### INTERNATIONAL SERVICE MONTHLY REPORT

July 2017

- Rotary Club of Clayton's project – **Moradabad Mobile Health Camps – India** (\$1,000). Still pending but advice has been received from John Barnes (RC Clayton) that the application for a global grant is with the TRF (The Rotary Foundation) and is in the question and answer stage. There were initially 8 questions on various parts of the application; these were answered and now they have three more. These are being answered by PDG Sudhir Gupta from the Rotary Club of Moradabad (the host Club) and a results is anticipated (hopefully) on approval in the next couple of weeks.
- Nasavusavu Special Education School.** No change from last month: - As of November this year the club will sponsor 15 students. RC FTG also is the umbrella club for the Special Ed. Section of ABCD so In addition to the 15 student we have seven other students with individual sponsors. Payment for next year's sponsorship is due in November and will be dealt with promptly on my return from overseas.

#### New Projects:

- PDG Carol Lawton and Frank addressed our club on 10<sup>th</sup> July to present the Malawi (Days for Girls) project. Members were interested and I am hopeful that we will go ahead with this project.
- Fairhills – Thailand Project.** Still pending.
- Term Deposit** (Ivan Gigovic funds): The Term Deposit will mature on 8<sup>th</sup> August. The bank has been notified that the club will draw down \$10,000 in addition to the Interest due and payable. I will give further thought to the projects listed in this year's budget and will get back to the Board with more information in November.
