As Karen and I travel around the District visiting the Clubs we find no two Clubs are the same; different meeting styles, times, procedures, and traditions. However, what does stand out is the fellowship and friendships of the members of all the Clubs and their passion for Rotary "to Good in the World". This Passion is divided into local, regional and international projects. The proportion of such projects in all Clubs varies depending upon the direction and skills of the members. For equity and uptake of all members it would be desirable to have an even spread of each but as all Clubs are autonomous there is no correct percentage of one over another and I am not going to espouse one for another. As Rotarians we all see needs in different places and then persuade our members and friends to follow a direction.

Now I am going to mention a 10-letter word. One you have all heard, one that makes your eyes glaze over, one that makes your ears bleed. A word and activity every Rotarian should have an interest in (not delegated to one person in the Club) otherwise the viability and sustainability of your Club and the projects that fire your passion will no longer be possible. Yes, the word is **membership!** Unfortunately, in our little corner of the world, the Clubs combined, which becomes District, have been steadily losing members. We punch above our weight on many fronts but on this basic necessity, we lag behind. One of the reasons I see is that many of us have lost that direction. We become tired of being the leader for that direction and haven't had the new ideas, energy and enthusiasm flowing through from new members to keep us inspired and passionate.

Just recently our District Membership Chair PDG Jenny Coburn released two papers on ways to change our direction. One paper called Organisational Membership Program where Clubs can connect with Organisations to be involved with Rotary to create member benefits, community service and networking. The other paper recommends the process for establishing Satellite Clubs. I believe these two papers give us new directions to stabilise and perhaps turn membership around. Of course, we could also go out and start new Clubs. Back in 2015 an Australian District Governor challenged all the Clubs in his District to start a new Club. This could be an Interact Club, a Rotaract Club, a Probus Club or even a Rotary Club. Today I would include an EarlyAct Club, like RC Wandin did recently. A challenge which I would like every Club in 9810 to become involved in. Or in District 9520, the District sponsored the formation of a new Rotary Club in a relatively new region south of Adelaide. Back in August there was a Regional Rotary Membership Conference held in Adelaide. Yesterday I received summary papers of the event. Amongst the many responses recorded these I thought were most noteworthy –

- "importance of change to attract a new client base.
- Importance of a digital presence that is viable to a diverse collection of community members who are seeking opportunities to volunteer their time and skills to assist others";
- "the message of change for ongoing delivery of service came across strongly, underpinned by a strong commitment to pilot the changes through strong direction";
- "the concept of a philanthropy gene was well received".

A report is currently being tabulated of the Conference which I will share when available. However, another concept I read about in my local newspaper, I thought could be taken up by every Club immediately. The article was titled "Rotary, more ways to join in". It reads "The Rotary Club of Hawthorn now conducts a fifth meeting each month for those who would like to be involved in Rotary but are unable to attend its regular weekly Tuesday luncheon meetings. The inaugural meeting was well attended and held on a Thursday night with guest speaker....." I thought this was a great initiative. Clubs would only have to choose a time and day different from what they are already meeting. With the recent changes of legislation this could be your third, fourth or fifth meeting. This would give your members more flexibility when to attend and could be the seed to start a Satellite Club for your Club. So, if you care about the sustainability and the future of your Rotary Club, I ask you to think about and support the initiatives of membership growth mentioned and continue to share your Rotary experiences with others and invite them to join Rotary. ROTARY: MAKING A DIFFERENCE.
